

IERRY'S IOTTINGS

Jerry Ford

"Look, I am making all things new" Rev 21v5 - New Living Translation

CHANGE IS AN INEVITABLE PART OF LIFE and it seems that the Church of England is not immune, whatever the view on its vital signs!

On October 29th the Dioceses Commission released details of its draft scheme to restructure the Church of England in West Yorkshire and the Dales. The overall proposal is to replace the existing three dioceses and create a new single one. The report explains in more detail how, if approved, that would work. The full report can be viewed at http://www.churchofengland.org/about-us/structure/diocesescommission/yorkshire.aspx.

As a very rough outline, the proposal merges the three current Dioceses of Bradford, Ripon and Leeds, and Wakefield and creates five 'Episcopal Areas' (Bradford, Huddersfield, Leeds, Ripon and Wakefield), each with a bishop dedicated to the parishes in their area and therefore more closely in touch. Each Episcopal Area would be 'co-terminous' with an Archdeaconry. (I think that means they follow the same boundaries!)

The broad impact on our parishes would therefore be a move to the 'Archdeaconry of Ripon and Craven' and the 'Episcopal Area of Ripon', all within a new Diocese of Leeds - also known as the Diocese of West Yorkshire and the Dales.

The decision making process is guite protracted. The earliest any of the proposals could be implemented would be in the autumn of 2013.

In the meantime, we are to have a new Archbishop of Canterbury who has the challenge of trying to unite different views on, amongst other things, women bishops and gay marriage.

And within our parishes, we are looking into the future as we prepare for a new priest-in-charge. The PCC at St Andrew's had a meeting with Paul Slater, our Archdeacon, on November 7th at which he outlined the Diocese's view of the role a new priest might be expected to undertake. As well as serving the 2 existing parishes of Gargrave and Coniston Cold, a new occupant would also take up responsibility for Rural Affairs across the current Diocese. Time would be divided two-thirds to the parishes, and one-third to Rural Affairs.

The next steps for the parishes are to prepare Parish Profiles, which provide details of the church and congregation, mission opportunities, and life generally in this part of the world. We also develop a profile of the personal qualities that we feel are needed to help meet our goals and aspirations. The Diocese will prepare similar documents for the Rural Affairs aspect of the role.

Once all of this has been agreed between parishes and Diocese, the post will be advertised (possibly from February 2013) and candidates interviewed by Parish Representatives (2 from each parish) together with a Diocesan representative – probably our Archdeacon.

We have work to do!

King Hezekiah, with Jerusalem surrounded by the all-conquering Assyrians and facing overwhelming odds, laid everything out before God and re-iterated his trust in him (2 Kings Chapters 18 and 19). Although perhaps rather daunted by the task before us, we aren't in quite the same perilous state as King Hezekiah. Nevertheless, we must remember that God is with us through everything we face, and we must continue to pray for guidance and discernment as we maintain our trust in Him. Your prayers for the PCCs and Parish Representatives would be appreciated.

Living the dream...

SOME PEOPLE ARE FANTASTIC WITH WORDS, using a very few of them to open up a universe of mystery and meaning. For example, when Wesley wrote of "our God contracted to a span" he put into just six words the nature of the Incarnation - and in a way that opens up the guestions rather than closing them down.

It seems to me that this is our task in Advent as we try, amid the commercial tinsel and mistletoe, to tease our imagination beyond the familiar or the prejudiced into glimpsing the mystery of God's gift afresh. For, in one sense, the mystery of Christmas isn't the end of the story, but the beginning of the experience of God's grace.



The point of living the Advent season is that we *live with* the story of God's people in God's world trying to work out where God is in it all. We walk with those who owned the calling to be God's people, but constantly got it wrong; with the prophets whose appeal to re-discover the implications of bearing God's name (i.e. reflecting God's nature) went largely unheeded; with those who were simultaneously amazed and bewildered by walking with the carpenter of Nazareth. The point is that the story calls us back to *living in the story* as if we didn't know the end: with Elizabeth and Mary and Joseph and working men and curious stargazers and fearful kings.

Ultimately, the mystery of Christmas is opened up by living with the shocking Advent possibility that God is about to break into the real world in which we live (and have always lived) and surprise us with love.

Unearned love, gratuitously poured out. Calling those who are grasped by the mystery of God's Gift to then live a life of generous and merciful self-giving which is experienced by those around us as God's gift.

This is not about bland piety. Just as Jesus is born into the real politics and economics of first century Palestine, subject to all the same health risks and capricious vagaries of mortal human life, so our reflection of the nature of the God we see in Jesus is to be lived out in the real world in which we live now. No escapism, no fantasy, no romanticism. As the German theologian Helmut Thielicke wrote in the ruins of his bombed church in Hamburg, God comes down into the frontline trenches where the suffering is as great as it can ever be.

We can dress all this up in great theological language. That's OK. But, it might be more useful to sum it up in the words of Canadian musician Bruce Cockburn:

The plane truth

"The best thing we can do with environmentalists is shoot them"

IT'S TIME TO LET YOU IN on a guilty secret. Environmentalists may have a reputation for hating flying – but I love it! Aircraft fascinate me. I flew a Bulldog RAF trainer before I first drove a car. I took the children to see the Red Arrows at Windermere Airshow last year.



I love the sensation, the speed, the freedom, the ability to get to the far corners of the earth.

I particularly enjoyed the

sight of a Boeing 777 taxiing down Riversway earlier this year (see below – try it on your street at http://taxi.ba.com).

Have you been waiting for the "But..."? Here it is....

A few years ago Bea's mother said she had seen something on TV by Adam Hart-Davis (I think) who said that the two big ways to reduce a typical person's carbon footprint were to avoid flying and give up car ownership. That sparked my interest. Neither seemed easy. People who own cars in rural areas like Gargrave tend to regard them as essential. People who don't own cars seem to manage without though. We still have our car, although we do most long-distance journeys by train in preference, and use our bikes and feet for lots of local trips.

Flying, though, seemed more of a luxury. Would cutting it out really make much of a positive difference though? Civil aviation contributes only around 2% of global man-made carbon dioxide emissions. But my responsibility isn't for global emissions (thank goodness), it's for the emissions due to my activities.

In the UK, aviation represents a rather higher 6% of emissions⁽¹⁾. That increases to 13-17% after taking account of the fact that emissions at high altitude are more damaging (so-called radiative forcing). The numbers are becoming fairly large now. But for some people they are far higher.

I have just tried filling in a carbon calculator⁽²⁾ which asks questions about my lifestyle and works out my annual carbon footprint.



I started off answering all questions accurately apart from the one about air travel, for which I invented a lifestyle of three return flights per year: one domestic, one short-haul to Europe and one transatlantic. By cutting out those flights my carbon footprint reduced by a spectacular 44%. That's a big difference by any standard.

So for many people in this country, the biggest single thing they can do to reduce their contribution to global warming is to cut back on flying. Yes, it may mean losing out on some opportunities to travel, but can we really compare the sacrifice of fewer overseas trips for rich Westerners with the suffering that climate change is expected to inflict in Africa or Bangladesh? In the first of these articles (May) I talked about Jesus's comand to love our neighbour applying on a global scale.

The good news is that many flights within Europe, at least, can be replaced with train journeys which, as well as being far less polluting, are often more rewarding, less stressful and bring us closer to the world we live in. For inspiration on how to travel almost anywhere in the world without flying, I heartily recommend consulting The Man in Seat 61...



When he was Prime Minister, Tony Blair gave a stark warning about climate change. On 30 Oct 2006 he said:

Unless we act now, not some time distant but now, these consequences, disastrous as they are, will be irreversible. So there is nothing more serious, more urgent or more demanding of leadership.

Two months later, in responding to the suggestion that he should *show* leadership by not flying to Barbados for holidays, he said:

a bit impractical actually...

Like many, he understood where we need to go but wasn't willing to take a large step in that direction himself. But we don't have to wait for politicians or anyone else to take a lead.

As for me... I still fly occasionally on business, although where practical travel to overseas meetings by train and ferry instead. We have been avoiding flying for holidays for the past few years. That won't be everyone's choice – not even Greenpeace is calling for people to stop flying totally. It's for everyone to work out for themselves how they can play their part.

Monthly Parish Meeting, I October

Apologies: Cllr Robert Marshall and (as it was Bonfire Night) PCSO Battison.

Public participation: An update was provided on the problems regarding the bus service to and from Upper Wharfedale School. Cty Cllr Shelagh Marshall is working closely with the parents concerned and North Yorks County Council Education department.

In the absence of PCSO Battison a police report on 16 incidents was provided to the meeting.

District Councillor's report: Simon Myers reported on the discussion taking place on the free car parks provided by Craven District Council. A meeting was to be held on 12 November to be attended by a number of Parish Councillors.

Reports of three meetings attended by Cllrs Mark Carruthers, Janet Sugden and Janet Turner were given to the meeting.

Highways: It was reported that Ringways, not Balfour Beatty, have a 10 year highway maintenance contract with NYCC. This includes provision of a rolling programme for the replacement of vehicles and equipment. Area 5 continues to exist and covers Gargrave from a base in Skipton.

Localism Act: A fund is being created from a tax on the sale of new homes; the proceeds of which will be passed to Councils. This replaces money provided by developers under Section 106. Certain of the areas which this money is intended to support will be very useful to future projects of the Parish Council. However the existing Community Grant will still be available for applications by voluntary groups.

Next meeting: Monday 3 December at 7-15 pm in the Village Hall.

bins in school, making elephants from milk cartons and the younger pupils making binoculars, telescopes and wind turbines from re-cycled materials.






