

JERRY'S JOTTINGS

STOP PRESS!!

Please note that the main Sunday service each week from January 6th onward is now at 10.30am

Breakfast at Epiphany (a bit corny, but I like it!)

EPIPHANY IS A GREAT WORD because it seems to have so many layers of meaning. The original Greek word "epiphaneia", meaning "manifestation", or "striking appearance" originally referred to insight through the divine.

January 6th is the Feast of Epiphany, which in the Anglican church celebrates the arrival of the Magi (or Three Wise Men), representing the revelation of Christ, the Son of God, to the Gentiles (non-Jews). In the Eastern Orthodox church, it is related to the Baptism of Christ in the Jordan River and the revelation of Jesus Christ as the Messiah, and the Second Person of the Trinity.

These days, the term is also used to describe breakthroughs in scientific, religious or philosophical thinking, but it can apply in any situation in which an enlightening realization allows a problem or situation to be understood from a new and deeper perspective; also described as 'eureka' moments.

Throughout the Bible, there are moments when men and women have sudden realizations about the presence of God, or their part in God's purpose. After Jesus' death and resurrection, several of the disciples were fishing, and realized that it was Jesus waiting for them on the beach, cooking fish for breakfast. (John 21; 1-14)

But to me, the greatest epiphany must have been with St. Paul. Not only did he have that moment on the road to Damascus that challenged his worldview, but both as a Jew, and an apostle to the nations, he must have spent countless days working through what seemed like paradoxes and inconsistencies between what had been his understanding of the Law and the Prophets, and what Jesus had taught, and how he had died.

Paul's letters, to me at least, read like outworkings of that process, trying to help others to come to that realisation that God's grace is enough.

"He has saved us and called us to a holy life – not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing (Greek – *epiphaneias*) of our Saviour, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel." 2 Timothy 1: 9-10

I hope that you all may experience a moment of realization during 2013, of one sort or another, and pray that we might all help others to experience and understand God's grace.

IN NOVEMBER WE WELCOMED Maria Glot as our speaker. She has visited us before and told us about Titus Salt setting up a prosperous textile business and building Saltaire as a place for his workers to live. This time her talk was about Salt's successors, a tale touched by tragedy, though the business continued to thrive. Even today many people are employed in the premises which houses a number of different concerns including a gallery devoted to the art of David Hockney.

Her own interest started when, as a child of Polish immigrants, she realised how her poor grasp of spoken English was holding her back at school. She timidly ventured into the library at Saltaire and met one of the Staff who offered to help her. From that eventful day she was encouraged to read out loud, to talk to the librarians and to read English classics like "Jane Eyre". She never looked back; eventually getting a degree and forming an abiding love of Saltaire and its history. Just the sort of story which encourages us to support our libraries today!

Titus Salt planned to pass the business on to one of his sons, another Titus, and built a splendid house for him on the site near Saltaire called Milner Field.

Three centuries before this the property belonged to a family called Milner. Their daughter was callously separated from the young man she loved, who later died. The girl cursed her parents and then committed suicide. The parents died soon afterwards and since then the property had decayed. Titus Salt regarded the curse as foolish superstition and acquired it for a song. However, when his son moved in he died suddenly, although still in the prime of life. A series of subsequent owners suffered similar fates and the property was abandoned in the Twenties and remains derelict. The planning authorities don't know what to do with it as no-one will live there!

Down in Saltaire business was strong as ever. One interesting development shows the enterprising spirit which turned a disaster into a new opportunity, quite in the spirit of the place. In the first world war the firm was commissioned to produce huge lengths of cloth for Russian military uniforms. Then came the Russian Revolution. The CEO of that time knew prominent members of the British Government and heard that they were proposing to set up an independent flying Service, the RFC, later the RAF. They needed a different uniform, he could produce masses of suitable cloth, and the RAF is still wearing grey-blue to this day.

All these stories kept us spellbound for well over an hour and we are considering a visit to Saltaire next summer. We hope Miss Glot will be able to show us round.

Other recent activities have included a coffee morning with a collective Christmas card made by the Caterpillar Club on which we invited anyone to record good wishes to people in the village, to enjoy a hot drink and a mince pie or two and, of course, chat to their friends. Five of us went to the Group Advent carol service at Conistone and are looking forward to a shared dinner in January.

Join the Big Garden Birdwatch 26 - 27 January

DO YOU LIKE WATCHING THE BIRDS in your garden? Then take part in the world's biggest wildlife survey – the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch.

This is the conservation charity's most important event of the year. It is when people across the country look out of their window and spend an hour of their weekend recording how many birds they see.

Last year, over half a million people counted more than nine million garden birds. The information from this survey helps the RSPB form a comprehensive picture of how well – or not so well - each species is doing.

Over the past three decades, participants have helped the RSPB discover that populations of house sparrows starlings have declined while the numbers of blue tits and goldfinches in gardens have increased.

Doing the Big Garden Birdwatch not only helps the RSPB track the ups and downs of garden birds, but gives you the perfect excuse to sit down with a cup of tea and enjoy the wildlife in your garden.

Taking part is very simple. Over the weekend of the 26-27 January, spend one hour counting the largest number of each bird species you see at a time in your garden. Then give your results through our website www.rspb.org.uk/birdwatch or by post.

GOING GREEN IN GARGRAVE

Are your clothes clean?

UNDER THE MICROSCOPE this month: something that many of us have never seen growing but which has a particular historic connection with Gargrave.

Organic food has become more and more popular. There are local producers and suppliers like Growing with Grace in Clapham and organic dairy farms close to Gargrave. You can find organic fruit and veg in the supermarkets, also organic meat and dairy produce. Many people buy it because they expect it to be healthier. Others are more concerned about the health of the bees or wild flowers that might be killed off by crop spraying. For others it may be about animal welfare or more sustainable farming. Of course there are counter-arguments too - after all there are reasons why farmers started using artificial



fertilizers and sprays in the first place. Gargrave gardeners faced with this year's plaques of slugs and other pests may well have some sympathy with pesticide use.

It surprised me a few years ago to find out that the crop that uses the largest amount of pesticide is not a food at all. You are probably wearing some of it now: cotton.

Half of all pesticide use in developing countries is for cotton growing⁽¹⁾. Heavy pesticide use reduces biodiversity, disrupts ecosystems, and contaminates water supplies. Worse still, pests exposed to synthetic pesticides build up a resistance to them. So each year, farmers have to buy and use more pesticides to grow the same amount of cotton - increasing the damage to the environment. This spiral can lead to farmers building up increasing debts. In parts of India agricultural chemicals take up 60% of the farmer's production budget (2). Also much cotton growing is in countries where farm workers are not well protected from the acutely toxic chemicals used as pesticides.

Sadly the problems associated with cotton growing don't stop there. Others include the use of genetically modified crops (65% of cotton production), a vast consumption of water which has almost eradicated the Aral Sea (11,000 litres of water for each kg of cotton grown), and exploitation of workers. Here's what the Ethical Justice Foundation says (3):

"Cotton production in the Central Asian Republic of Uzbekistan represents one of the most exploitative enterprises in the world.

Up to one third of the country's workforce is made to labour on cotton farms; denied ownership of the land they work, and forced to labour without reasonable wages they are unable to opt out of cotton cultivation - those who try are subject to violence, imprisonment and intimidation. Tens of thousands of children are forced to pick the cotton harvest each year. Crucially, the suffering caused by this industry comes at the hands of the government. It is the Uzbek state, not the country's mafia that instigates the abuses connected to the production and sale of cotton turning its people into a slave nation."

In October the Soil Association launched a global campaign to spread the word about organic cotton. According to their website cottendon.org, the five unique benefits of organic cotton production are:

- 1. Give control to farmers, not GM companies
- 2. Eliminate hazardous synthetic pesticides
- **3.** Help farmers feed their families: organic cotton enables farmers to grow other crops.
- 4. Save precious water
- **5. Combat climate change:** organic cotton farming uses less energy and healthy organic soils store more CO₂



You can buy organic cotton products from specialist companies like People Tree and Green Fibres or from mainline retailers. H&M is the biggest user of organic cotton worldwide $^{(4)}$, with C&A at no. 2 (Coats and 'Ats, my grandad called them) and Nike at number 3.

Organic cotton clothes can cost more than the alternatives, but I do tend to wonder who is paying the rest of the costs if I see clothing (or anything else) at a crazily low price. Perhaps it is the farmer who may be paid less for their harvest than it costs them to produce? Or the environment, degraded and polluted by fertilisers and pesticides used with only profit in mind? Or the sweatshop workers in Bangadesh who may have had to endure working conditions far harsher than our ancestors did when they spun cotton at Airebank Mills?

Resignations: With sadness the Council accepted the resignations of Cllr. Keith Bradley who had had a stroke but is thankfully now recovering and Cllr. Roland Thomas due to his heavy time commitment to the Village Hall. The Council thanked them both, on behalf of the village, for their sterling voluntary work.
