

DAVID'S DISPATCHES

Christmas and New Year is a busy time of year: what with buying presents, getting in the Christmas food and drink, concerts and shows in the Village Halls and Churches, parties, charity events, Carol Services, and the School Carol Service and Nativity Play... not to mention sorting out hundreds of oranges and candles for the children's Christingle Service, and then the traditional "Midnight Mass" and bellringers ringing in Christmas Day.*

As we all gear up for Christmas we think about our families and friends as well as people who are less fortunate than ourselves. We also remember that God became one of us – came to live as a human being on planet earth – with all its blessings and all its problems.

Jesus wasn't exempt from life's problems: He was born and raised in a lovely country but it was occupied by a foreign power; the Romans and local rulers brought stability and prosperity but they brutally put down rebellions by local people. Joseph and Mary probably had enough, but they were not wealthy, and then Joseph seems to have died young leaving Mary widowed with Jesus and several younger children. When Jesus began to preach, teach and do miracles many people followed him, but the religious leaders began to feel threatened and made life difficult for him - and many people stopped following him. He had a close group of disciples, and saw them begin ministries of their own, but even they deserted him when the authorities decided it was time to have Jesus arrested and executed.

So Jesus' life was just like ours: there were good, happy, fulfilling times but there were also very hard times. And that's the story of this world too, isn't it? Life on planet earth can be great, but things sometimes go terribly wrong. And, if we're honest, we are a bit like that ourselves: we can be great friends and neighbours, caring and kind, but sometimes we do or say things that we come to regret.

In theological terms we can say that we are made in the "image of God" but, to some extent, that image is marred by sin; and we can say that the world is "very good" but in some ways it is cursed. God has a solution to this but, thankfully, it is not to just get rid of the world's imperfections – He would have to get rid of us too! We are imperfect just like the world we live in!

Instead, God's solution is to get involved in our world. To be with us - in the good times and in the bad, the highs and lows, the joys and sorrows of human life. Jesus came to earth as a baby to share life with a human family and friends. And Jesus still wants to share life with each of us today - spiritually.

This world is not heaven, and never will be, but having God with us in our lives is the next best thing. It's the best foundation for living a good life: guidance to make the right choices, and strength to face life's difficulties. As we think about that baby, born to a poor family, born to suffer just like the rest of us, and born to die so that we could share his spiritual life, let's be glad that God was one of us, and that He wants to be one with us.

CONNECTING WITH CULTURE

Brennan Jacoby, London Institute for Contemporary Christianity



Filling the pews with disbelief

Recently the leaders of the London-based, self-proclaimed 'godless congregation', The Sunday Assembly, began a tour during which they will launch 45 new gatherings around the UK, North America and Australia. This tour reveals a growth in the ranks of what Theo Hobson, in a piece in The Spectator, has dubbed 'the new new atheists' – non-believers distancing themselves from the more combative 'new atheism' of Dawkins, Dennett, Harris, and Hitchens.

A central message being preached by the new new atheists is that people don't need to believe in the existence of God, or gods, in order to benefit from religion. This view was popularised by Alain de Botton in his 2012 bestselling book, **Religion for Atheists**. He argued there that the wisdom, morality, art, architecture and institutions associated with organised religions can help people live more flourishing lives, regardless of whether or not they accept the metaphysical claims motivating religious culture and traditions.

How might Christians receive news of this current rise in atheists who value some of the accoutrements and practices of their faith, but not their God?

One possible response could be for Christians to provide more compelling talks, catchier songs, more progressive art, and a richer sense of community than is offered at atheist gatherings. However, important though those dimensions are, such an approach as a first response would be ill-founded. Christianity is not primarily about what humans do, either individually or collectively, but rather about what God has done to enable human flourishing, the 'life to the full' promised by Jesus (John 10:10). Christian culture and tradition is second to Christian acceptance of God's grace.

Instead, I would suggest that Christians receive the development of religious atheists as an opportunity to reflect critically on the extent to which their own Christian gatherings are based on, and dripping with, the gospel that made them believers in the first place. The wisdom, morality, art, architecture and institutions that tend to come with religion **can** benefit people, regardless of what they believe. But the very compatibility of religion and atheism testifies to the fact that theism is not, primarily, about religious tradition. Where it has become little more than religious practice, Christian theism could do worse than thank the new new atheists for this latest reminder, and use the opportunity to refocus them and us on the good news of what God has done in Christ.

A SHORT HISTORY OF LOW, OR GOFFA, MILL

Construction of Low Mill probably began about 1797 when Betty Hudson from Keighley bought spindles and rollers from Hattersleys, the engineering firm, also in Keighley. These parts would have been used in the construction of the spinning frames which were being set up to spin cotton in this new mill. Keighley was one of the major centres for the new cotton industry in Yorkshire with thirty cotton mills built in and around the town after 1780. Betty Hudson, possibly a wealthy widow, had built Damside Mill in Keighley and her daughter married Thomas Parker, a former publican, who built Arncliffe Mill, also for cotton spinning.

Low Mill and its contents were insured for £1,500 in 1799 and was run by Betty Hudson's grandson James Parker. He had a partner, Samuel Gill from Grassington Low Mill for a few years, but James Parker & Co insured the mill and contents for £1,800 in 1810. By 1811 James Parker and his new partner from Hebden Mill, William Hepworth were bankrupt so this mill was for sale.

The sale notice gave some useful details about the mill mentioning that it was three storeys high and measured 74ft by 29ft within the walls, with a most powerful water wheel. This wheel had a 'never failing supply of water in all seasons', which enabled it to drive fourteen twist frames, each with forty-eight spindles and a throstle with 148. There was also a house for a manager or owner and twelve cottages together with a spacious garden with fruit trees.

It was added that, 'In the village of Gargrave, children and proper mechanics are in constant supply, at very moderate wages'. One further point, which was often mentioned when local mills were for sale, was the proximity of the Leeds ϑ Liverpool Canal, although of course it wasn't open to Liverpool at that time.

In 1838 a worsted mill with a steam engine was listed in Gargrave and in 1842 it was for sale. The dimensions given in the sale notice were about the same as Low Mill. If it was Low Mill the machinery included combing machines, nineteen spinning frames with 96 spindles each and the usual 'mechanics' tools'. Thirty acres of land was also available.

Worsted spinning may have stopped by 1853 as there is no mention of this mill in a trade directory for that year. By 1911 it was occupied by the Meridian Lighting Company. The later name of 'Goffa Mill' came from its use by the Gofar Tyre and Rubber Company.

Dr Ingle has published several books on local textile history and is contributing a series of articles to this magazine on the early history of the textile mills in and around Gargrave.

CHRISTMAS MEMORIES

ONE OF MY EARLIEST MEMORIES, in the 1930's, is of falling downstairs on Christmas morning with my new doll and being more worried about the doll than myself. Luckily both of us survived!

Memories of being a pupil at school at Christmas time are very limited but when I started teaching it soon became one of the busiest and happiest times of the school year. All the displays needed to be painted, modelled and put up, the ornaments for the tree that miraculously appeared in the Hall had to be made, Christmas cards designed and made and in addition there were the rehearsals for the Nativity Play at school. Many will remember the choral speaking and the carols and the play written each year by Mrs. Hemingway. In addition, many children and adults connected with the school were also involved in the Nativity Play in Church. A busy time! Particularly if you were one of those chosen to be either singing angels (at first boys only) or trumpet angels (girls).

Then came the Christmas parties - with Father Christmas. Much to the consternation of the children he once actually kissed Mrs French!

There had obviously always been special events at this time of year and it is recorded that in 1876 children at the Wesleyan School gave a Service of Sacred Song entitled "Pilgrim's Progress" on Christmas Day.

On December 22nd 1932 the Log Book reports that there was a Christmas Party at the Wesleyan School from 3.45pm to 7.30pm. "Tea provided by staff, a cracker, orange, apple, packet of sweets and a present were given to each child. A varied programme including songs, recitations, carols, pianoforte solos and games were indulged in and witnessed by many parents."

Christmas parties have been held throughout the years at both schools. One memorable one for me was the year that I overheard my son claiming to have eaten at least seventeen chocolate finger biscuits! I quickly moved away!

I hope that these few memories will spark many more happy ones of Christmas.

Operation Hawk, North Yorkshire Police's campaign to clamp down on rural and cross-border crime, is now in full flight with the new Road Crime Team.

At the Gargrave Parish Council October meeting, PC Chris Doyle reported that

there had been an increase in rural thefts in the Craven area including livestock being stolen from Bank Newton, Ingleton and a large number of sheep stolen in the Malham area. Operation Hawk is dealing with this in line with Country Watch.

If you see anything suspicious and need to report information of a matter that is a non-urgent please dial 101 for North Yorkshire Police.

Monthly meeting 7-15 pm, Monday 4 November

Apologies: Cty Cllr Shelagh Marshall, Craven District Cllr Simon Myers, Parish Cllr Brian Atkinson

Public participation: Robert Marshall reported on his representation of the village at a recent meeting at Settle of representatives of Parish Councils in Craven to discuss the possibilities for railway station adoption in the villages and towns along the Leeds to Morecambe line. The led to a discussion of the newly opened car park at Gargrave station. It is a few yards beyond the steps leading to the down platform (for trains from Leeds going north and west).

The village PCSO gave a report on crimes in the area. She was asked about speeding on the A65 and on Church Street. Various types of speed traps were discussed and she agreed to look into possible actions to slow down speeding drivers.

Cllrs. Janet Sugden and Janet Turner reported on two recent meetings which they had attended. At one Julia Mulligan, the Police and Crime Commissioner, had talked about her "helicopter view" over North Yorkshire and her powers to hold Dave Jones, the Chief Constable, to account if necessary. She

went on to explain the "place of safety" beds to be created in York and Scarborough for people with mental health problems to avoid the use of police cells for such people where possible. She also mentioned that "Operation Hawk" aimed against rural crime is producing positive results.

The Tour de France: Clare Hudson of Craven DC gave an overview of next year's Grand Depart in July. A full practice run of the operation will take place sometime in May. After this practice the definitive road closures will be announced; they are currently only in draft. People need to be aware that it will be difficult for anyone to move around the area for several days before and after the event as well as on the day of the stage through the area.

The route and associated roads will be closed by NYCC from 6am on the day of the stage. At that point any vehicles on those roads will be removed although pedestrians and cyclists will still be allowed until 9am. Also during that period the road sweepers will go through. At 9am the roads will be handed over to the ASO, the race organisers, who will keep them closed for several hours before handing them back to NYCC.

Those who wish to watch the race should travel to their vantage point to arrive no later than 5am on the day of the stage, travelling overnight if necessary.

People should consider stocking up on shopping in advance of this period and arranging appointments, e.g. medical ones, outside this period
