

DAVID'S DISPATCHES

Rev David Houlton

Summer is almost upon us and hopefully it will be as good as last year! It's great when the weather is good enough to be able to relax and enjoy nature around us, to wander round the village, or just stand around and have a chat, without being drenched or blown away. Last month we were thinking about how nature shows us that it is reasonable to believe in a good God — even though, sometimes, terrible things can happen in this world. This month let's think about that other big question - whether there is a conflict between science and religion.

In May we hosted a meeting of the "Society of Ordained Scientists, Northern Chapter, at Gargrave church. Although it sounds like something out of Harry Potter, the SOSc is actually an Order of vicars who have scientific qualifications and are dedicated to explaining how, in Christianity, God and Science work together.

Some religions see scientific knowledge as a threat (as have some parts of the Christian church in the past) but there is no need to: Truth is what it's all about... after all, Jesus said "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life"!

Part of the problem some people have is that scientists on TV always seem to be atheists. So it is surprising to hear that many leading scientists are committed Christians. Famous examples include: Dr Francis Collins, until recently Director of the Human Genome Project; Rev Dr Sir John Polkinghorn – who gave up his post as Professor of Mathematical Physics at Cambridge University to retrain to be a vicar, and Prof Alister McGrath, who holds three doctorates from the University of Oxford - in Molecular Biophysics, Theology, and Intellectual History. He was an atheist but became a committed Christian and is highly critical of the famous Oxford atheist Dr Richard Dawkins. Another critic of atheists is Prof John Lennox, Professor of Mathematics at the University of Oxford. He once said that atheists may think that Christianity is for people who are afraid of the dark... but in fact atheism is a "delusion ... for people afraid of the light"!

As someone who spent thirty years in research and design in the Chemical Industry I can confirm that I didn't find anything in science that was incompatible with true Christianity. In fact, I'm so convinced about Jesus that I gave up the day job to become a vicar!

So, with my colleagues in the Society of Ordained Scientists I pray to God: Almighty and everlasting God, ultimately it is You who made the Universe with all its order, atoms, worlds, galaxies and the intricate complexities of living creatures. Grant that, as we probe the mysteries of your creation, we may come to know you more, and faithfully fulfil our role in your eternal purpose; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

We started with asking them what they don't like about the playground and all their comments were written on a flip chart. Then we moved onto what other playgrounds they got to and why, what type of play is their favourite whether it be climbing, spinning, sliding and that helped us lead onto what products they would like to have for their playground.

It looks like the zip wire is top of the wish and want list and other equipment they want has to be versatile for different types of play and be imaginative. For example a point they made was they only want a climbing wall if it's really high because you can only do one thing, and if it isn't really high they don't want it.

Slides and climbing frames are a big favourite, and trampolines were mentioned a lot too. But I think the helicopter pad, and tent to play your Xbox in sadly is unachievable this time round. Everyone could write on post stick notes for the last part of the session and were placed next to products saying why they like it and why they don't which worked really well and was interesting for everyone.

Phoenix to Salt Lake City Part 2

AFTER WE LEFT our new friends and their tarantula in the town of Congress, we continued cycling through the semi-desert country and then started climbing into a range of mountains until we came to a small town called Ash Fork. This was on the historic Route 66. We stayed in Ash Fork for two nights in a motel run by a very nice English couple. Dave had picked up a stomach upset and didn't dare be far away from the bathroom for long.

He was much better the following day, so we set off up a long hill climbing gradually for about 17 miles. We arrived at a town called Williams which was about 7000 feet above sea level, which is roughly the height of the south rim of the Grand Canyon. We had a meal at a diner in Williams and the service was very poor, so when we came to pay the bill, the waiter asked how much we wanted to tip? In America, they make a great thing of tipping. Dave said \$1 and he was lucky to get that. We knew we wouldn't be going there again!

We had been travelling in an easterly direction up Route 66, but at Williams we had to turn left and go north towards the Grand Canyon. We had about 50 miles to go and on the way we saw an old railway engine belonging to the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe rail company. It had got rather rusty and dilapidated.

When we got to Grand Canyon village the only place we could find to stay was a very posh (and expensive) hotel. We asked for a safe place to keep our bikes and we were told we could take them into our room. So we had to wheel our rather scruffy bikes right through the hotel to get there. The following morning we rode the few miles to the actual Canyon and it really is a breathtaking sight. A very high WOW factor. We had a helicopter ride over the Canyon, which was

fantastic. We stayed for two nights in the hotel and were then faced with the problem of how to get to the other side of the Grand Canyon as we wanted to cross over into Utah and on to Salt Lake City. The Canyon is 277 miles long, so we would have had to ride many miles east to Page or ride even further west to Las Vegas to get round it.

Dave had the idea of hiring a small plane with a pilot, so we went to the small airfield and did just that. It was a very small plane with just room for me to sit in the back with two bikes and baggage and Dave was in the co-pilot's seat. The pilot was a young man called Patrick whose job was to take people on short sight-seeing flights over the Canyon. He said it was a very boring job and his ambition was to get a job with one of the big airlines. He said taking us over to Utah was a welcome change.

So we set off and flew right across with sensational views. We had decided to go to a town called St George, so as we got closer, Patrick radioed ahead to get permission to land. The answer was, "Sorry, but you can't land here, the runway is out of action, it is being resurfaced," and indeed we could see some large machinery parked in the middle of it. Patrick asked, "What do we do then?" Back came the reply, "You will just have to fly around until you see another airstrip and try to land there."

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

AS FARMING IS ALWAYS AT THE MERCY of the weather and there are never two years the same, nature of course is a great leveller. In the Dales April is the main lambing month. What a difference a year can make.

2013 was one to remember. Many farms now have a modern building which can be used for lambing in adverse weather conditions. The emphasis in modern buildings is on ventilation, south facing and Yorkshire boarding (rails with a gap between). The prevailing wind for rain is west, for snow east or north. April 2013 a blizzard came from the <u>south</u> with very fine snow filling many buildings on the open side. The snow being so fine went through the Yorkshire boarding, smothering hundreds of ewes and lambs. Grass was very scarce and due to a poor harvest grain was in short supply for feeding livestock. Not a good year for sheep farming.

In contrast 2014 has been one of the best lambing times I can remember. We had the storms and floods during which a lot of time was spent feeding the ewes with silage and concentrates. This kept the sheep in good condition, producing strong lambs. This coupled with good weather meant that lambing time was a pleasure. The grass must be three weeks ahead of last year.

I have contact with farms in Sydney, Auckland and Estevan: Australia, New Zealand and Canada. I spoke to all three one day in February. It was raining!!!. Sydney: 40° C with forest fires, Auckland a drought with no grass, Estevan 40° below. I decided Gargrave ain't bad.

By the time you read these notes Spring will be well and truly here. Take a stroll on the Pennine Way and tell me of a better place!

Appleby Horse Fair: The Council agreed a date to install the wooden posts around Low Green and agreed to buy some extra posts ready to use if necessary. The volunteers for this work were thanked in advance.

Playground: It was agreed that there will be an open afternoon at the playground at 2pm on Saturday 31 May. In addition to villagers, invitations are to be extended to members of Grassington Juniors football team who use Low Green on a regular basis and the volunteer Playground Group.

Neighbourhood Planning Group: A member of the Group showed the Council the draft of a pamphlet for distribution to all houses in the village. The Council approved its format and content.

World War I centenary: At 7pm on 4 August there will be a special gathering in the village culminating in St. Andrew's church for various events. The War Memorial was discussed with a view to having it cleaned in the approved manner. Sources of grant finance were noted.

County Councillor's report: County Cllr. Shelagh Marshall provided the Council and a large number of residents at the meeting information about the impending changes to the buses. The new bus timetable is on the basis of two buses provided by North Yorkshire CC and is to be sent to the Parish Magazine. We are still awaiting the announcement from Craven District Council Planners, regarding their preferred sites for building 75 new houses in Gargrave over the next 15 years.

Meanwhile, many of you may be wondering, what exactly is a Neighbourhood Plan and how will it affect the village we all live or work in?

Well, in simple terms, a Neighbourhood Plan is a way of helping local communities to influence the planning of the area in which they live and work. It can be used for:

- Developing a shared vision for your neighbourhood.
- Choosing where new housing, including affordable housing (ie houses which are not normally for sale on the open market) is to take place as well as influencing the type of buildings and what they should look like.
- Provision for businesses to set up or expand their premises.
- The development of schools, places of worship, health facilities, leisure and entertainment facilities, village halls, community and youth centres etc.
- Protection and creation of open space, nature reserves, allotments, sports pitches, play areas, parks and gardens and the planting of trees.
- Transport and access (including issues around roads, cycling, walking and access for the disabled).
- Protection of important buildings and archaeological remains.
- Consideration of renewable energy projects such as solar energy and wind turbines.

In order to formulate a Neighbourhood Plan, the Working Group will be asking for your opinions. Various opportunities for everyone to comment will be available in the coming months, either at events in the Village Hall, or by way of a questionnaire delivered to every household and business.

A website will also be up and running to provide info and allow feedback.

Your views are really important, so together, let's plan a great future for Gargrave!




