

#### DAVID'S DISPATCHES

THE NAME "GARGRAVE" probably goes back to old English or another Teutonic language but, with the remains of a Roman Villa at Kirk Sink, and a Roman ford still visible near the bridge, it's clear that we have a long heritage. So I'm looking forward to the Exhibition the Gargrave Heritage Group are putting on in church at the start of November.

It coincides with one of the traditional times of year for remembering our heritage and roots. At this time of year, around All Soul's Day, people in many Christian countries bring flowers to the graves of relatives, and light candles & say prayers to God, as they remember family and friends.

So, on Sunday 2nd November, during the Heritage Week, the 10.45 church service will focus on our family heritage. And, from 2-4pm there will be opportunity, while visiting the exhibition, for everyone to think about people we have known and loved, to light a candle, say a prayer, and join in special prayers remembering those who have gone before us.

Christians have always believed that there is hope in death as well as in life. Indeed, most serious academic scholars now agree that the early Christians always insisted that Jesus was raised from the dead. It wasn't something made up at a later date to justify Christianity. It is there in the earliest Christian beliefs - recorded from just after Jesus was on earth. And, of course, many of us have experienced something of the spiritual side of life – things that go beyond the physical.

So it's not really much of a surprise that scientists at the University of Southampton published work in October, examining more than 2,000 people, which found that nearly 40 per cent of people who survived cardiac arrests (at hospitals in the UK, US and Austria) had some sort of awareness while they were clinically dead - even though the brain shuts down about 20-30 seconds after the heart has stopped. For instance a man in a Southampton hospital recalled leaving his body and watching his resuscitation from the corner of the room. Dr Sam Parnia, formerly Research Fellow at Southampton, now at New York State University said: "The man described everything that had happened in the room, but importantly, he heard two bleeps from a machine that makes a noise at three minute intervals. So we could time how long the experienced lasted for ... everything that he said had happened to him had actually happened."

We are not just physical beings. Jesus said "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

That is his promise to all of us that trust and follow him. We can have His forgiveness and blessing now. We can know Him in our hearts and lives on earth. And He doesn't forget us when we die; He will give us new life with Him in heaven.

Personally, I have a growing list of friends that I am very much looking forward to catching up with, in due course!

Having been established in Settle for two years, Kathy and I would like to say a big thank to the residents of this area in North Yorkshire for your amazing support. Local shops need local shoppers, and you are helping to keep a small market towns up here vibrant. We appreciate all the support we have received.

When Kathy and I moved up from Bath (where we were also working with traditionally-made cheese), we were welcomed very warmly by all the residents of Settle and we have been so encouraged by the support we received from day one. Thankfully you were prepared to come and try out The Courtyard Dairy, and you welcomed our ethos to supply only top-quality rare and unusual cheeses - for which we thank you, because some farmers we work with would not be able to continue to make cheese and farm if it wasn't for you buying their cheese through us. We remain extremely dedicated towards championing and keeping alive traditionally-made farmhouse cheese.

Unfortunately there are not many farmhouse cheese-makers left (for example, there's only one farmer in Yorkshire making unpasteurised cheese with milk from his own herd of cows). We believe it is more important than ever to champion the small family farms that make cheese with milk from their own herds and flocks - making sure money and employment remains in the rural communities and keeping alive traditional and sustainable farming practices. And, most importantly, their cheeses taste great too - a real expression of each farm!

For those of you interested in how Kathy and I work with small farmers and what we are looking for when we visit each farm to select out the cheese batches for The Courtyard Dairy watch this five-minute video at www.tinyurl.com/kirkhams.

Thanks again for all your support – we are extremely grateful and we enjoy living in Settle and being part of the community. And for those of you who haven't yet been in the shop - please do pop in for a taste of the cheeses: we know you'll be pleasantly surprised by their great value and wonderful depth of flavour.

November is highly significant for our hedgehogs for 2 reasons. The first is Bonfire night (week) and the other is for hibernation, with many going into hibernation around mid-November.

November 5<sup>th</sup> comes first, so please do take extra care when checking bonfires. It is far better to collect the materials for the fire and only put them into place on the day it is to be lit. Those built before the day can attract hedgehogs so should be inspected before lighting. If possible, lift the materials around the bottom edge of the pile using a broom handle or similar, and check for extra piles of leaves, or you may even see the hedgehog itself. A disturbed hedgehog may also make a hissing sound (like a snake) to try to intimidate those disturbing it. Start by lighting one side of the bonfire, and allow the guiet side, ie the side with the least people standing around, to remain unburnt for a few minutes, as this may allow an escape route for any missed hedgehogs.

If you find a hedgehog, put it in a high sided box with some meat-based cat food and a towel to snuggle under. Put it in a guiet place, and once the noise etc has died down release the hedgehog with its dish of food.

Larger hedgehogs will go into hibernation around mid November. Those that do not hibernate (Autumn Juveniles) will need extra help, particularly when the weather turns colder.

Regular visitors should be able to cope, provided extra food is put out every evening. Weighing them regularly should ensure there is a weight gain. If there is a problem, eg out in the day, or there is only a small weight gain, or it is still considered too small to hibernate and the weather is closing in, then contact the BHPS for details of a local hedgehog rehabilitator. In addition, those wandering without a regular supply of food, and especially when there are frosts expected, will struggle to find any natural food, so they too will need to be rescued. So if you find a hedgehog that you have not seen around before, weigh it and call the British Hedgehog Preservation Society for advice.

If you are concerned about any hedgehog, or you see one out in the day, contact the BHPS on 01584 890801 (if you can weigh the hedgehog first that is always helpful, but do use gloves when you handle them). NOW FOR SOMETHING completely different

My second husband Arthur, was a self employed builder and I used to help him sometimes with some of the jobs he got. I was the labourer and he did all the clever stuff, but I used to enjoy it. One particular job he got was to build a single storey extension on to the living room of a semi-detached house. It was to be a separate room with a door leading through to it.

I think basically it was an overspill for the house, because Mr and Mrs Smith were hoarders, every room was full of everything imaginable. Apart from furniture there were piles and piles of books, papers and magazines and just lots of *things*. There were narrow passages between the clutter, you had to squeeze your way through to get from one side of the room to the other. They obviously didn't want to throw anything away, because you never know, it might come in!

Now Mr and Mrs Smith were nice people, but they were very tight with their money. They both worked, I don't know what Mrs Smith did, but Mr Smith was a travelling salesman for a company which supplied funeral directors with all their requirements. He went round with his samples and took orders.

Anyway the building work went well and when Arthur had finished the structural work, he then had to paint the guttering. He asked Mr Smith what colour of paint he would like, so that he could go and buy some. Mr Smith hastily said there was no need to buy anything, as he had something suitable that would do.

He produced a tin of what looked like brown paint, so Arthur started using it and indeed it seemed quite adequate for the job. After he had done some of the painting he wondered what shade of brown it was, so he looked at the label. He found he wasn't using paint at all - for the label simply read, 'COFFIN SEALER!'

#### Rude parrot

When he took the parrot out five minutes later, the bird was transformed. Iam just so sorry. I was completely out of order. I promise I will never be rude to anyone again.' The minister was happily astonished, and put the bird back into his cage. He was about to go back to work when the parrot coughed politely and ventured: "Mind if I ask something? When I was in the fridge just now, I wondered: what had that chicken done?"

OCTOBER HAS A LONG TRADITION of Yorkshire farmers attending Oban cattle sales – Oban being the town on the northwest coast of Scotland which provides a lifeline and services to many of the Hebridean islands. The Auction Mart in Oban provides a gathering place for farmers and crofters from the Highlands & Islands to sell their cattle and sheep.

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

My first recollections of Scotland were as a 15 year old, taken on holiday by an uncle to the cattle sales. It was my first holiday ever, one I shall never forget. My first trip out was on a ferry up to Loch Sunard to collect 70 cattle off a pier. Pens had been erected on the deck, and the cattle penned. The Island of Coll was the next call. Returning to Oban late that night (the auction was situated in the town with a railway line into the auction yard) gangways were placed onto the deck with the cattle driven through the streets to the auction. I cannot imagine this being done today. Can you imagine driving a hundred cattle through the streets these days?

The sales consisted of four days The Monday sale was of suckled calves off the Highlands, the Tuesday one, off the mainland. There was a full day of dairy cattle, mostly Shorthorn and Ayrshire, many of which come to Yorkshire. The beef breeds were mainly Angus, Highland and Hereford.

The highlight for a 15 year old was the day for the Highland Cattle sale, to see them all washed, and horns polished, never mind the owners' kilts!!!

Each evening, most of the cattle were loaded onto cattle trucks to be moved by steam train over a wide area – motor transport was only in its infancy.

How many readers remember cattle pens at Hellifield, Bell Busk and Gargrave? There was a time when up to 500 dairy heifers were for sale.

It has all changed now. Following a beef shortage during 1950-60, the government paid a headage payment for all beef bred calves. As a result, I bought the last two dairy heifers off the Isle of Lismore in 1975.

As our farming system has changed, I have not bought cattle at Oban for some time, but I enjoy visiting and attending the sales and meeting friends, with all the banter. To see all the autumn colours at his time of year speaks for itself. Over the years, the weather is often good at early October. The sunset over Oban bay can be fantastic. Although our Scottish friends are divided over the "Yes/NO" referendum, they can a least have a discussion!!!

#### HAPPY CHILDHOOD

Enid French

I AM VERY FORTUNATE and grateful for being born in Gargrave and living here for almost all my life. I cannot think of a better place! A village that has grown and grown over the years but is still beautiful with good walks away from the heavy traffic on the main road.

Growing up, everyone knew everyone, and woe betide if you did anything wrong! You could be sure someone would tell your parents: one of the best deterrents for making you stop and think before you were naughty!

The two schools in the village were run in parallel and whilst I went to the Wesleyan (Council) School, my husband of the future attended the Church School. We never attended the same school at the same time although in 1942 the school arrangements were changed, and the Council School became the Infants School and the Church School catered for the 8 to 11 year olds. That is when, instead of just crossing the road to school, I had to walk all through the village and over to the other side of the river. There I was in a class taught by Miss Townson, who I later often teased about only letting me play a triangle in music lessons!

I then had much further to come home for my dinner. I cannot remember any children that I knew being late for meals even if we were just playing out. I often arrived before my Father, coming home from Johnson and Johnson on his bike, and dismounting as he crossed the main road from East Street. Motor traffic was considerably less than now! Having said that, there was quite a rush from the factory at finishing time. The cinder track across the green was well used.

Perhaps I should say that being born in one of the Smallholdings, I then lived at 40 Skipton Road until I was married in 1957.

At that time the village had many and varied shops, for example, three butchers, three bread and cake shops, the Co-op, the Post Office, three grocers, greengrocer, newspaper and sweet shops, two fish and chip shops and one or two shops that sold all sorts, as well as the chemist. Also three public houses and probably some establishments I have temporarily forgotten.

With the war in 1939 came the blackout - no street lights and even no lights showing through the curtains at home. I can remember being sent to Gilligans' fish shop and, as was usual then, having a long wait for my turn, and coming out to find that it was pitch dark and being very glad to reach home.

Also with the war, came rationing, and as far as I was concerned, sweet rations. My Father used to take us to buy our ration either at Mr. Hogan's - who sometimes, if he was in a good mood, would give you one or two extra, or to Miss Hudson's who had 'better' sweets but only gave you the exact amount.

The grapevine was very good at alerting people to a consignment of tinned fruit, for example arriving at the Co-op, and all who could went to queue for their share.

We were lucky living in a country place because the occasional rabbit or old hen supplemented the rations. And one big plus was that we were fairly free from air-raids, even warnings, the worst and nearest raid being at Coniston Bridge. (I am told by Dennis French that the only casualty was a rabbit.) Indeed the scariest experience was an earth tremor which actually knocked some newspapers to the floor in our sitting room.

I hope these jottings remind many people of happy times in their childhood whether in Gargrave or elsewhere. For more memories, please visit the exhibition in Church early this month.




