

DAVID'S DISPATCHES

IT'S NOT EVERYONE'S BIRTH THAT IS USED AS THE STARTING POINT FOR NUMBERING THE YEARS. Yet we tend to take the birth of Jesus Christ for granted nowadays and forget the momentous impact it made on the history of humankind – then and now.

The religion Jesus founded "went viral" – spreading west across the Roman Empire, despite regular persecution and purges, and spreading east across what is now Iraq and Persia - getting as far as parts of south-east Asia and the Indian subcontinent. It spread south into Africa (the Egyptian and Ethiopian Copts are two of the most ancient churches) and it spread north to places like Armenia – the first country to adopt Christianity as its official religion.

In Europe and Britain, the movement Jesus founded survived the dark ages and invasions by pagan hordes – including the pagan Anglo-Saxons. Our forebears in Gargrave were probably converted by Celtic Monks. In fact we still have parts of the crosses that were probably set up in a field (where the churchyard is now) around 800 AD. English law came to be very much founded on the Ten Commandments and other biblical moral codes.

Later, the King James Bible and the Book of Common Prayer came to define much of modern English. Even today, Jesus' teachings in the Sermon on the Mount are still held up as some of the best (but very challenging!) ethical teaching on how to live life well – they still get quoted in Parliament every now and then.

Today there are more Christians in the world than followers of any other religion (or non-religious philosophy). Even in atheistic countries like China, many people are converting and following Jesus - despite the high personal cost. They risk being discriminated against or even persecuted.

The Economist magazine reported in early November that 230 church buildings have been demolished recently – in just one Chinese city*. Yet they also reported that it seems even some of the ruling Communist Party have, quietly, become Christian believers! Similarly, a few years ago, an Arab TV station showed long lines of Africans who had converted to Christianity and were being baptised in the sea.** There are now many Iranian churches, even in Britain, and there is even a Church of England Bishop, Michael Nazir-Ali, who comes from a family that only became followers of Jesus recently!

Jesus' Spirit reaches out in love towards everyone. The spiritual power of Jesus's message and self-sacrifice eventually conquered the Roman Empire - despite discrimination and persecution. And they are still at work in this world.

So, as we gear up for Christmas and think again about God becoming one of us: Living as a human being on planet earth; Teaching us how to live; And even being prepared to sacrifice His life for us - to give everyone a chance to know God's blessing and presence in this life and the next - Be Careful. He turned the world upside down then, and He hasn't give up on us yet!


Over the Christmas break the Library will close at 1pm on Saturday 20th December and reopen at 2pm on Friday 2nd January.

Mick and I started planting in the silver birch (being my favourite tree) and a few others got planting in the Oak trees. The children ran up and down tirelessly collecting for people and handing out canes, I was so proud of them, they truly loved it!

After a few cold hours we stood back and looked at the 100 trees we had planted in.

It was time to warm up with a hot drink, then we held hands in a circle and wished the trees well. It sounds silly but it was the perfect end to a perfect morning. Nature is a wonderful thing and to do something to help it always grounds us and makes us happy to be alive!

A few weeks back, the Playground group met with the Parish Council and h the Proludic rep, who has designed the final proposed plans. We now have to wait for the final decision from the council as ultimately the playground will be their responsibility and we have to respect any decisions or areas they need to check before allowing the project to continue. In the meantime, as a group we are planning our next meeting, and we are completing two of the big application

forms for the larger funding from Yorventure and Lottery Reaching Communities. We have started receiving letters of support too, which are essential when applying for funding. So a big thank you to David Houlton, Simon Myers, Sarah Peel and Alan Poxon.

Our next fund raiser is at the craft weekend, Gargrave Village Hall, December 7th-8th, where we have a stall selling all sorts of pretty things made by and donated by lots of lovely people we know.

Our working group has now grown to 15 members and it's definitely a team effort. We want to say thank you to everyone who has given their time to come and supported us. We appreciate all the help we have received, and we will share more good news in the New Year!

Making Space - Dementia Support Service in the Craven Area

Over 25 years ago, the Making Space Charity was born and served a much needed role in the North West providing care and housing for those people with mental health

problems and support to their carers.

I should know, as it changed the life of my sister who, 25 years on, remains in residential care with the charity. I know firsthand how helpful and caring the team who work for this charity can be. It is because I wanted to give something back that I applied for a position as a trustee. Making Space was looking for someone with human resource management skills and, following an in depth interview, I was offered the position. It is not a paid role: the reward is making a difference to the lives of people who really need our help.

Today, Making Space has developed its mission to support a wide variety of needs including those with physical and/or mental health conditions, learning disabilities and dementia. I am therefore delighted to share with fellow residents in Gargrave that Making Space has come to Craven to set up a Dementia Support Service.

What can Making Space offer you

You can tell us you need help but we can also hear it from a family member, a friend, neighbour or a health professional. Sara Robinson, our support worker will then contact you, as soon as she can, to find out what your needs are. She understands how anxious you may feel and her key aim is to understand and offer practical support.

She will get to know you and recommend what support can be offered to enable you or your loved one to continue to live a full life. She can also put you in touch with other services that may help.

What can Making Space offer the carers

Carers make a massive contribution to society and they are entitled to have support in understanding more about dementia and the skills they may need both now and in the future to manage more effectively. Sara will want to help you develop ways to ensure you keep your loved one at home for longer. You often feel so tired supporting your loved one on your own and she can help you work through what is available and what is right for you.

You will find it is such a relief to talk with someone who really understands the illness. She can also put you in touch with others dealing with the same issues and ensure you are up to date on the latest thinking.

Sara will work out what works best for you.

AVOID THE CHRISTMAS QUEUES PRE-ORDER FOR CHRISTMAS AT THE SHOP NOW John Hall

I WRITE THESE NOTES for the magazine on October 8th, which is the traditional day for cattle coming down from the hills to prepare for winter. Let me explain: it has been a tradition in this area to send the young cattle on to high farms for summer, to allow more grass to feed the milk cows, and make hay or silage for winter.

My first recollections of this practice was in the 1940s, when ours went to a farm in Malham. It was, of course, all walking, usually on a Saturday, when John was off school!!! It was always a relief for cattle and man - after being tied by the neck in barns all winter - when spring arrived with new grass and some sun. The chosen morning, it was up and off through the village, and up Coulthurst Lane, to Bell Busk and onto Airton. There was a watering trough in a yard in the centre of Airton where stock could rest and drink. The drovers could have a sandwich!

It was rather strange how my grandfather used to arrive and commandeer the horse and float, to accompany us on these trips. His instructions or "advice" were not always welcome or popular. Not a man to argue with.

From Airton to Malham was always easier as the cattle began to tire and were much easier to control.

Droving was part of my life during school days. Most farm animals: cows, sheep, horses, even geese, would be walked to market.

Many times have I walked to Skipton auction before school, walked them to Skipton, and caught the bus back to Gargrave in time for school - not always fun on a wet morning.

As you can imagine it was essential to have a good dog to assist on the roads. I started training sheepdogs whilst at school. It is still one of my hobbies as I have always had good dogs. They are so loyal, and great companions.

Things have changed dramatically: as road transport increased it would be impossible to walk animals on the road. We still send stock to away land, but they are not all moved in trailers.

The British weather has often been a topic of conversation, with droughts, floods, or storms. 2014 must go down as the best year of my life as farming or gardening is concerned: an abundance of growth, sun showers and warmth.

The cattle have returned looking well and content. The sheep and lambs have never been better, with a good supply of silage. In November the cattle are moved inside for winter. On the farm every season changes, there's no time to be bored. The days lengthen in a few weeks!



I thought I would have a change this month and have a different type of story. This is an indirect result of various journeys I have made over many years, mainly cycling trips. I have noticed some rather strange and amusing street names on my travels, so I started to write them down and gradually collected a long list. I only 'collect' names I actually see, I don't go through A to Z lists. I have printed these names out, and put them into different categories which makes it more interesting. Amongst these are food and drink, money, people, clothing, parts of the body, and various other categories. To start with, I'll mention some of the animal street names I have seen.

I found a Green Dragon Lane in Bridlington, which I imagine was probably called after a pub, unless of course there really was a green dragon living in the vicinity. One of the first names to catch my eye many years ago was Tom Cat Lane near Wetherby. I think that was probably one of the names which started me off with my collection.

Then, beginning with the smallest creatures, I saw a Snail Lane in Hampshire, Wasp Nest Road in Huddersfield and a Beehive Lane in Warwickshire. Moving up in size, we have Crab Lane in Seamer and Frog Lane is in Wiltshire. There are plenty of birds remembered in street names. I used to pass Cuckoo Nest every day on my way to work in Bradford. It was just a small back street in an industrial area of the city. It was a long time before I realised that cuckoos don't have nests of their own, since they lay their eggs in other birds' nests. I've seen Swallow Lane, Magpie Lane, Owls End, Chicken Lane and Duck Hill which is in Ripon. Lots of other birds are remembered in street names too, such as Swan Lane at Ashton Keynes and Goosebutts Lane in Shropshire.

Domesticated animals are not forgotten. What about Piggy Lane in Withernsea or Nanny Goat Lane at Stone in Staffordshire! There is a Shaggy Calf Lane at Slough, and Cowpath Lane is in Somerset. I spotted Donkey Lane at Cheadle and Horse Race Lane was seen in Avon. Finally, just to keep all these animals in order, I was delighted to find Noah's Ark Lane at Uckfield in Sussex.

Those Christmas Ads

You know Christmas is on the way when the adverts start to appear on TV. For me it always used to be the jovial Father Christmas on Coca-Cola's big red lorry, or the buoyant Toys R Us commercials. Nowadays you can't get through most of them without welling up.

The big name brands have already totalled over 30 million views on YouTube alone, with John Lewis, Boots and Sainsbury's creating the biggest stir.

John Lewis have, through Monty the Penguin, touched upon the significance of relationship for each of us. The focus here on romantic relationship is perhaps not the most helpful – but Monty's story is one many of us will relate to. Recognising that it's not good 'to be alone' (Genesis 2:18), we long for authentic relationship, whatever form that takes. Ultimately Monty finds his needs met, in a gift given on Christmas by one who knows and loves him deeply.

The desire for relationship and community is also touched on through Boots' NHS shift-worker. The TUC noted that there were 172,000 workers on duty on Christmas Day 2010, mostly in service-orientated industries, and that number can only have increased. Boots have championed those who serve others, sometimes to the detriment of themselves and their families. As one midwife described her own experience, 'working over Christmas can be lonely. All you really want is to be with your family. So to see them get up early – just to cherish you – that's amazing.'

And so to Sainsbury's cinematic recreation of the Christmas truce, which has, in this centenary year, drawn both critique and acclaim. Whilst the advert clearly doesn't even attempt to capture the true horror of trench warfare – at this point in 1914, one million lives had already been claimed – it does remind us of those extraordinary moments when, even at the darkest and toughest of times, a light might shine in the darkness, and that darkness will not overcome it.

Whatever we make of the adverts, the gestures they embody towards relationship, community and peace come together in the one who is truly able to offer them. Indeed, what a time for Christians and churches to call out that which is good, as we are reminded again of the amazing love of God towards us – reminded that the Father sent his one and only Son into the world. Immanuel. God with us.

Last month I missed out at least three shops present in Gargrave when I was young. Memorably one of them was a Saddler, Harry Howard, who, apart from making saddles and other leather equipment for horses, also mended shoes and did other leather work. Occasionally we, as children, would call in his shop, the smell was lovely! However, he once let the cat out of the bag, by telling me that he had finished a music case for my Mother. It had been going to be a secret present for Christmas!

On Saturday nights, in the summer, he would nip into our garden and select the best bloom as a buttonhole and then, with a cheeky grin, wave to Mum, sitting in the window watching the world go by and usually doing some crochet work.

One other worker in leather in the Village was Wilf Inman. In his upstairs workroom at the back of his shop in the High Street, he not only mended but made shoes for people.

Opposite him was the Forge - run by the Sibcy family, father and son. Here, yes, on the High Street, he shoed horses and hammered metal. The son, Arnold, enjoyed the dances held in the then Village Hall and to dance with him was to be virtually carried round the floor!

Not only were there dances in the Hall but also occasional film shows when you queued up on the outside stairs to gain entry. Happy days! even in the rain!

To go back to schooldays - I have to confess to once, and only once, faking illness to avoid going to school in the afternoon. This was during the war and coming home for dinner I knew that in the afternoon we were to have a Ministry of Information film. I hated them. They scared me and, looking back some parts were really quite graphic for nine or ten year olds.

The only other time I managed to miss school, apart from childhood illnesses, was when in, I think, 1946, the Pennine bus company decided the weather (snow etc.) was too bad for them to run for a whole week. Hurrah! I was disgusted when someone suggested that I could always go on the train! We always made the most of snow by sledging, quite tamely, down the Crofts, or more adventurously down the hill adjoining Eshton Road and Raybridge.

Thinking of fun and playing out, do children still play "hide and seek" and the version we used, in which you could move from hide-away to hide-away when you thought the catcher wasn't looking! Great fun!

Monthly meeting, 3 November

The Parish Council welcomed a representative from Craven District Council's Finance Department. She spoke about the 2014/15 Budget Survey and asked residents to comment on the Balancing The Budget Survey which can be found at www.cravendc.gov.uk. Reponses should be sent before 5 December by e-mail to budget@cravendc.gov.uk. She agreed to find out more detail about the amount of precept which would be passed on to Parish Councils and about the prospect of charges for the use of North Street and West Street car parks.

Correspondence: North Yorkshire County Council have sent the parish Council a map showing the only areas in which they will cut grass in future. These are road junctions where cutting will be sufficient to maintain visibility for road users. No other areas will be mown. The junctions where mowing will take place are:

- 1. Eshton Road/Swire Croft Road;
- 2. Swire Croft Road/Smithy Croft;
- 3. Marton Road/Walton Avenue;
- 4. Marton Road/Walton Close;
- 5. A65/Raybridge Lane;
- 6. A65/Eshton Road:

- 7. A65/East Street;
- 8. A65/Chapel Court.

Remember, from October's meeting, that there is a small group seeking volunteers to help maintain the green spaces in the village? Please contact our Clerk for more details.

Finance: The external audit has been completed and our documentation accepted. Villagers have the right to inspect the Annual Return. Please contact our Clerk for more details.

NB Please also read our response, below, to Craven District Council regarding their Draft Local Plan. By the time you read this we should have held several more meetings with Craven District Council and our consultants, Kirkwells, regarding the Neighbourhood Plan.

30th October 2014

Gargrave Parish Council Representation to Draft Craven District Council Local Plan (September 2014)

As you are aware, Gargrave Parish is in the process of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan. The Parish Council and the Gargrave Neighbourhood Plan Working Group have recently appointed consultants to assist us in the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan. As part of the Neighbourhood Plan, in general terms, we are looking to allocate land in the village for housing and commercial uses (as deemed necessary by strategic Local Plan policy) and to put in place policies that protect our green spaces and improve our transport infrastructure. As part of this process we are currently working on a number of things:

- 1. As you are aware, we have commenced engagement with the village on both the Neighbourhood Plan and the Craven Local Plan. We have already undertaken a round of consultation in relation to the sites that have been included within the Local Plan to ascertain village views on the development of that land for the proposed uses. At the same time we asked the village which sites they may alternatively consider to be suitable for development. The results of this work have been written up in detail and have already been informally shared with you. We also include a copy of our report with this letter as a formal submission for your consideration.
- 2. With the assistance of our appointed consultants, we are preparing a 'narrative' to explain the proposed scope and extent of the Gargrave Neighbourhood Plan in terms of draft vision, objectives and key emerging themes and to set out what the Parish would like to see achieved through the proposed Neighbourhood Plan once Made by Craven District Council. This was also discussed as a necessary step to inform the next steps in preparing the Draft Neighbourhood Plan at our recent meeting. We are aiming to have something finalised by the end of November 2014.
- 3. Again, with the assistance of our consultants, we are reviewing the available evidence base to understand the information available and identify any gaps. In particular we have already identified that there is a distinct lack of evidence in relation to the employment land need and associated draft employment / mixed use allocations for development in Gargrave. We also have some concerns relating

to the site assessment process, in particular in relation to the application of criteria relating to flood risk / the lack of reference to the latest Environment Agency Surface Water mapping. We suggest that these gaps / issues are considered by the Council as the Local Plan progresses, and would request that Craven District Council support the Parish Council in ensuring that Neighbourhood Plan policies, as well as strategic Local Plan policies are underpinned by a robust evidence base.

- 4. We are currently preparing to undertake our own site assessment process to ensure that any proposals that the Parish Council / Neighbourhood Plan Working Group put forward as part of the Neighbourhood Plan process are grounded in our own localised and robust evidence base. As part of this process we are intending to undertake a short Call for Sites in November. We will be assessing the existing SHLAA sites, and any other sites submitted as part of the Call for Sites process according to the SHLAA site assessment criteria and any agreed local criteria prior to Christmas. The results of this process will feed into an emerging preferred option draft plan.
- 5. We propose to consult with the community early in 2015 in relation to a proposed alternative approach to the Draft Local Plan allocations, alongside other Neighbourhood Plan proposals in line with our narrative.

In order to progress with our approach in a manner that allows Gargrave the autonomy to formulate our own plan for the village, as intended by the NPPF and the Localism Act 2011, and as set out in the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012, and to ensure the village community understands and contributes fully to the evolving process, we suggest that it is necessary for Craven District Council to review their approach in the next version of the emerging Local Plan.

The Parish Council therefore formally requests that the site allocations process is undertaken as part of the Neighbourhood Plan process for Gargrave, rather than through the Local Plan. It would be far from ideal for the Neighbourhood Plan and the Local Plan to be progressing with different allocations - this would cause confusion and duplication and stand to undermine both processes. Our consultants, Kirkwells, have experience of this approach in other Local Authority areas and will continue to provide professional planning policy advice and support throughout the process.

We propose that a meeting is convened in mid-November between the Council, the Parish Council and the Gargrave Neighbourhood Plan Working Group and our consultants. At this meeting we will be able to present you with our emerging narrative, our proposed site assessment criteria, and most importantly discuss and agree a way forward for the progression of the two plans. Neither the Council nor the Parish Council want to see a void or unnecessary delay in local planning policy at the Gargrave level, but it is important that the Parish is given the ability to plan for its own future via the Neighbourhood Plan. The Council has a duty to support the Parish in its efforts, and we believe that working together, through setting suitably evidenced policy at the strategic Local Plan level, and setting local policy and allocations via the Neighbourhood Plan would achieve the best outcome for the village.

We will be in touch in due course.
