

DAVID'S DISPATCHES

WINTER IS HERE and Christmas is behind us. It started with the switch on of the village lights at the Summerseat. After that was the annual Gargrave Nativity Service, and the School Nativity, in church. Then carol singing round the village by the Playground Association, and carol singing in the nursing homes, pubs and Co-op(!) by some of Stan Drew's choir.

Just before Christmas there was the Carol Service with the Giggleswick Brass Band at Coniston Cold, and with the Embsay Band at Winterburn (in a polytunnel - Brr!). On Christmas Eve there was the family Christingle Service at 4pm and Midnight Mass (at 11.30pm) in Gargrave, and then finally on the 25th the traditional Christmas Day Communion Services in church at Coniston Cold and at Gargrave.

As Christmas approached, we all prepared ourselves for it, and we got involved. And we did that as a community, and as families, not just as individuals.

And that's a bit of an allegory for the whole of life, isn't it? We all affect each other and need each other, so we should always be getting ready... We should be getting ready, but not just for Christmas. We should be getting ready for Jesus Christ himself.

Jesus came to earth to bless us, and He still comes to us spiritually – to bless us and to make us a blessing to each other. So it's worth always being ready spiritually – ready to be blessed by God, and ready to be a blessing to each other. After all, the time we have on earth is all too short. And it's all the time we have: time to get close to God; time to be close to our families and friends; and time to care for others and make a positive impact in this world.

That's why Heather and I often spend part of a day at Christmas or New Year thinking, talking together, and praying to God. How are things going - spiritually and personally? What about our families and friends? What should we be involved in doing this year to contribute to our community, and to bring good into the world? Then we make choices about our weekly commitments, and the coming year. It isn't as dramatic as making bold New Year's resolutions (which I never managed to keep for more than a few days anyway!). But it is a way of carefully seeking to follow Jesus throughout our lives – so that, at the end, we won't be looking back with too many regrets.

Jesus called His first disciples to "Come, follow me" and He is still calling each of us "Come, follow me". He loves us! He calls us. And He gives us time to choose. To choose to live life with Him – in the good times and the bad.

"Father God: as we start 2015, help us all to turn to away from wrong things and to turn towards the good. Bless us, bless our families and friends, and bless our community. Send your Holy Spirit to each of us, so that we know you more and more in our hearts and lives, and to help us to

follow Jesus in our lives."



GARGRAVE AUTHOR IS A HIT IN CHINA

Bank Newton resident, Chris Emmett, has made a splash in Hong Kong where his autobiography, 'Hong Kong Policeman,' has topped the former colony's bestseller list.

The book started life as an after dinner speech but turned into a 260 page account of the author's early days as a colonial police inspector. "I wanted to write about an exciting time and of the wonderful people I worked with," Chris told us. "It was hard finding a UK publisher so I pitched the book to Earnshaw Books, a Hong Kong based company owned by Graham Earnshaw. Graham has lived and worked in Hong Kong and Shanghai for decades. He guided me through several rewrites, which was hard work but well worth it."



As it turned out, the critics agreed. The South China Morning Post reported "...Few descriptions of the decade's colour match the author's vividly streetwise portrait..." The Post's sister publication, the South China Morning Post Sunday Magazine, called the book, "...honest and often hilarious..."

The book covers Chris's early years in the Hong Kong force, which he joined in 1970 having spent three years as an English bobby in Warrington. "Those early years in Hong Kong were a wild, maybe even crazy time." Chris told us. "After a year in general uniform duties, I moved to the Chinese border. This was the tail end of the Chairman Mao era and things were pretty tense. After that, I did a tour with the paramilitary Police Tactical Unit then went on to command a regional drug squad before moving to CID."

In August last year, Chris returned to Hong Kong to launch the book. "It was my first visit since I retired in 1998 and I saw a lot of changes," he told us. "There's a sense that Hong Kong is becoming part of the greater China. There are Chinese flags everywhere and all public announcements, including those on public transport, are in Mandarin as well as the local, Cantonese, dialect. The military Headquarters in the heart of the business district has a neon, People's Liberation Army, symbol on its roof. There's a lot of nostalgia for the colonial era, particularly with Hong Kong's youth, who probably don't remember much about that time."

MORE THOUGHTS ON EDUCATION

READING LOG BOOKS from the time of the First World War, one of them states that the school had to be closed slightly early because the gas was not turned on until five o'clock and, as it was December and one of the darkest months of the year, it was too dark to work. The installation of gas must have been very

welcome as presumably beforehand the school relied on candles, Tilly (oil) lamps etc. Remember at this time there was no general electric supply, it would be some twenty years before that became more general. In fact electricity was installed in the Church School during the summer holiday of 1939 at a cost of "£44.3.9, subscribed by scholars, old scholars & friends. Grant made by W.R.C.C. of £10.12.9." On the 28th August a "wireless set sent by W.R.C.C. temporarily fitted for use in connection with the Crisis Evacuation of Children Scheme."

It is easy to forget that most things we take for granted have only come about in recent times. Probably education, like everything else, has changed more since the Second World War than any other period of history. It has evolved from the Victorian idea of passive children being fed facts, often by rote, to allowing children to develop in their own time and ability, and now back to a much stricter curriculum again. Every child is different and every child needs different things and at different times, and, in any case we need a variety of people to keep our world safe and happy. The practical people are just as important as the academics! - they are the ones who make our lives more comfortable. But we do also need dreamers, forward thinkers and scientists, academics, researchers - in fact people with every sort of interest and ability. That is what makes life so interesting!

OUR CHURCH I DIDN'T GO TO

Note from Duncan Faulkner: My friend Paul who is a C of E minister in Dorset wrote this article about his village church which I thought would be a thought-provoking read for us in Gargrave & Coniston Cold. Comments welcome!

I AM IN A DILEMMA which has caught me by surprise. The church in the village in which I grew up is going to close. It is a small church in a small village of perhaps 120 houses. When I lived in the village 20 to 30 years ago the congregation was small. On some Sundays it now numbers 3.

When we first moved to this village in 1979 the pub had already closed down but there was a village shop, a garage, a village hall and the church. By the time I left home both shop and garage had closed and village life, though strong, centred around the hall, the annual village fete and the church.

In the churchyard are now the remains of my grandmother, my father and my sister. I never went to this church and nor did my family – it was our church that we didn't go to. But it was, as for so many other villagers, our church. It holds a significance and a memory that unites me with all those with whom we shared life in those years. And so as I hear news of its demise I feel that this is undoubtedly a loss to a village and community which is slowly losing all of the communal resources that guietly make community life what it is.

And yet...there is a reality here that can't be ignored. The 120 houses of this village were all leafleted and all given an opportunity to offer time and skill to keeping the church a village church. Only 3 people responded. The cost of maintaining and heating this building, even for the occasional service, on the

basis of an electoral roll in single figures, is not sustainable. The local vicar has this, plus another 7 or 8 churches in the area to oversee. The clergy resource is being spread ever more thinly across these small villages and their historic buildings. This makes clergy less and less effective and more and more exhausted and liable to stress and burnout.

Since leaving home and the village church which I didn't go to I have found faith and a vocation as a vicar in the Church of England. I have ministered so far in urban settings and now lead a ministry that is seeking to create church communities amongst people who are unlikely to engage with traditional forms of church.

I am a little surprised then about my feelings toward the closure of a church I never went to. Except that perhaps it connects with the feelings so many feel toward the gradual erosion of something precious in villages up and down the country, the loss of a way of life that has survived for centuries. Even I am open to a dose of nostalgia for something that seemed boring when I was growing up, but which I now realise has immense value.

And yet... two principles tell me that this is the right thing to do, and indeed that we ought to be braver and do it more.

1. The people of God are nomadic not sedentary and their gathering places should reflect that.

God's people have always been sojourners, nomads, people called from place to place. We need structures. We need places to gather and places that can focus our worship and our sense of God's presence. But once those places become so rooted, so fixed, that we cannot move on we risk losing something of who we are as God's people. We are much more people of the tent than the temple – when we are truly living up to our call.

2. The church is ultimately future oriented because it is animated by God's Holy Spirit.

It is the Holy Spirit that births the church and then sends it out into the world and into the future. Of course there is an important dimension of celebrating and reflecting on the work of God in the past, but only is so much as we can be encouraged to move on into the future, in our own walk with God and as communities in mission. The Holy Spirit is sent into the world and then calls us to where He already is – so we are constantly moving into the place and time where God already is – not back to somewhere where God has been.

So in a small way I have to do what I believe the church constantly needs to do in order to continue to fulfil its call to be nomadic people of the Spirit – let go of the old structures, listen to the Spirit and move into God's future. This is a death and so will be accompanied with pain and sadness. But that is what we must do if we are to truly be the church we are called to be.

Some might say that my old village church will just turn into a symbol of the demise both of the church and of the community. Well, perhaps it will. But in a world longing for community, but sometimes struggling to know how to recreate it, it must surely be an enlivened church that, listening to God's Spirit, will discover new and more relevant ways of building community and creating new communities of faith in our historic rural villages.

I WAS FASCINATED TO READ the articles of Ray Payne, the Brighton evacuee. If my memory serves me correctly, could there be two Thompson brothers who lived at West Field on Marton Road: could they also have come from Brighton? There may be other readers who could enlighten us further.

I seem to remember two tall brothers attending Ermysted's, one of whom was suddenly struck down one morning with polio. He spent a time in an iron lung and it left him with a leg in irons. Within a few days, polio struck again, this time a man who worked on the War Agriculture Committee driving the threshing machine round the local farms. Brian drove the tractor and thresher to Scaleber one night to thresh the corn next day. He never came the next day – he was seriously ill with polio. I remember him well - his son Bevin Summersgill and I were good school friends.

My recollections of evacuees was somewhat different. I accompanied my mother to the railway station to meet a group of children from London's Tooting and Mitcham area. They had been bombed out of their homes - the area they lived in was flattened due to the Blitz (nights had been spent in underground stations). They arrived in what they stood up in, with a card round their necks with a name on.

The local volunteer groups found homes to take a good number in, and they attended schools. A certain Miss Preston from Flasby Hall comes to mind as one of the organisers. We were to meet one, a boy called Geoffrey Cheek, who was taken in by my grandfather who lived at Stoneycroft down Skipton Road. He and I became very good friends, and as a result, he spent most of his time on the farm.

A John Cann lodged with a Miss Davis on Scale Hill; Miss Frankland who lived next door had a Heather Smith. A Mrs Hodgson who lived at New Brighton, across the field from Scaleber, had two girls whose names escape me. Being on a farm, with a mother who always kept an "open house", surprise, surprise, weekends and school holidays, this little group drifted up to Scaleber. They had never seen a cow or a sheep. At first they were terrified of a cow, and called them all "boos", in their cockney accents, (bulls to us). They had no idea of where milk came from. When some chickens hatched out of an egg, it was unbelievable!

When one looks back, one thinks what a lot they went through, and how we escaped the bombs, and how tough it must have been to be put on a train, not knowing where you were being sent, at ten years old.

In 1944, rationing became very severe. For instance potatoes were rationed to 3lbs per week, likewise 2 oz bacon, 2 eggs and 2 oz sugar. Life must have been very difficult in town at this time. Living on a farm did have some compensations. Milk, potatoes, vegetables, meat, and oatmeal porridge kept us well fed.

We always had several "visitors" at weekends who arrived with various bags, sacks or baskets. On these occasions, John was always sent on an errand or somewhere. How many my mother supplied with eggs, milk, bacon and, at

times, potatoes, I'll never know. It may have been illegal, but she could never say "No". (Could it be black market?)

Contact with Geoff was lost on his return to London. His parting words were that he enjoyed the farm, but not being with my grandfather. I am not surprised as he was very strict and not easy to live with. I often think of the tough life those evacuees went through.

ANOTHER CATEGORY OF STREET NAMES which I have collected includes parts of the body and clothing. One street that is quite close to Alma House in Ripon is Barefoot Street. I wonder if that was where the poor of the city used to live? We could keep those feet warm with Stockings Lane in Staffordshire and Clog Sole Road in Brighouse, but what happened to the upper part of the clogs? At the other end of the body there is Head Street in Pershore, though I suspect it probably means the head of the town. Warning Tongue Lane is near Doncaster and Elbow Lane is in Bradford.

Leaving Salisbury Youth Hostel one year on a trip to the south coast, we passed Petersfinger Road. I've just looked this up on the internet and it is a corruption of Peter and Vincula which means Peter in chains, referring to St Peter. If you want to know more I suggest you also look on the internet as I could write an essay on it (but I'm not going to). If you haven't got the internet, this is a good reason to learn as there is such a wealth of information on it. Right, end of lecture and back to my article. Knaresborough has a Blind Lane and I think quite a lot of you will know of Bare near Morecambe, well there is a Bare Lane there, sounds draughty!

I think we should have some clothing here after that. Bonnets Lane is in Dorset, Black Hat Lane is near Exeter and Cocked Hat Road at Sowerby near Thirsk. That is the head taken care of and all I can offer for the body is Swapcoat Lane in Lincolnshire. There must be a story there, but I don't know where that comes from. Well, I'm afraid that's it, I don't have any more clothing or body parts to offer.


