

DAVID'S DISPATCHES

HEATHER AND I have lived in cities and towns in various parts of the UK and abroad, and we always tried to get to know the people living around us. But that is increasingly hard in the modern world! What if they always use the car and drive in and out of their driveway? What if everyone living on the street already has friends elsewhere in the city? What if crime is high so everyone goes straight home and locks the door?

What's more, many people are wealthy enough to be able to live independently. We don't need to ask each other for help and favours anymore. So you might be excused for wondering whether Jesus's teaching - "love your neighbour as you love yourself" is as relevant today as it was when people were mostly poor and needed each other much more?

But, surprisingly perhaps, our situation is not so different to the situation when Jesus gave that command. There were different people groups living in the same country, there were rich and poor, there was crime and violence, and people living near you might speak Aramaic, or Greek, or Latin! So even back then, people asked Jesus "Who is my Neighbour?" And His reply then applies today too: Everyone we come across is our Neighbour – people like us, and people who are not like us: right or wrong, good or bad!

In fact, Jesus' challenge was never to work out who our neighbour is. His challenge was and is to love Everyone we come across! Not the feeling of love, but the attitude: being patient, kind and caring. Respecting people – even when they are wrong. Wanting the best for them, whether or not they deserve it! Never giving up on people. And caring about their successes, and tragedies.

Committing to loving all our "neighbours" as we love ourselves, at an appropriate level of intimacy, is our contribution to making everyone's lives and relationships work better in 21st century Britain.

Lord Jesus, help me, help us all, to love and care more – like we see You did here on earth!



Faith Pictures is a short course designed to help Christians talk naturally to friends, neighbours and colleagues about what they believe. The heart of the course is about helping people to identify a single picture or image that embodies something of their faith. This is because the kinds of communication which best stick in the mind are concrete and rooted in story

The course aims to be accessible and light-hearted, without jargon or inflexible methods. Each session contains a short video and encourages discussion in pairs and as a whole group.

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

AT THE RISK OF BEING a "grumpy old farmer" I would like to draw attention to the footpaths over Scaleber Hill. A farmer YES! Old YES! Grumpy? I leave that to your

imagination. As of late I have received many complaints from local walkers about the state of the paths.

As most will know, it is part of the Pennine Way over which I have no control whatever. It is a grass footpath open 365 days a year. Many events take place over the year including the recent spine race over the whole 268 mile route. A fantastic endurance race in the middle of winter, on possibly the wettest time of the winter. As an endurance race this is no doubt exceptional for the competitors. As a keen sportsman and fell walker, I am all for the sport and competitors, and for Tom Hollins to complete 268 miles in 99 hours 25 minutes is amazing.

May I add a note of caution with regards to the path. It is of course a soil path and for two years the path has suffered severe pounding by events in mid-winter. Both years the event coincided with possibly the wettest day of the year. With all those feet and the rain, the path was rather like Flanders. Unlike some race courses, it is in use 365 days a year and does not have time to heal.

I have contacted the organisers to point out the damage if conditions are severe. Could such events be run at other times of the year? Or could diversions be made should the weather be severe? The next event is in July, which should cause few problems. The organisers are happy to discuss any problems. It would be interesting to hear readers' comment.

From the farming aspect, the rain relented after the race and a couple of fine weeks has improved the situation. As lambing time looms, attention to the sheep is essential. Liver fluke is causing problems. A mild open winter is ideal for liver fluke so the sheep have all been treated. The ewes are in good condition - as yet no snow storms to weaken them.

I received a "Can you just...?" visit to "Coveys" for a supply of ewe cobs.

Some nice dairy heifers have calved, with an improved sale price.

The snowdrops are out; daffodils are growing. Roll on Spring.

Memories of Old Gargrave - 1950

(extract from "Gargrave News" - unknown author)

A LONG TIME AGO, Gargrave used to have a very famous Parish Tea shortly after Christmas. It as a really splendid affair and everyone went.

The whole morning was spent in the hall preparing juicy ham and tongue sandwiches. My father used to take the morning off and carve up two beautiful hams. All the food was donated and the tea was 2s 6d. with wonderful cakes. Every lady who had a table brought down her prettiest tea set, shining silver teapots and flower vases. People vied with each other to set out their table splendidly. As children, we thought it was a grand day and were sent on errands and hung around ready for tasting any broken cakes.

About 4 o'clock the tea started. Grace was said by the vicar and then the tables filled up. Everyone wore their party frocks and a really splendid tea was served.

Later in the evening a very amusing concert was held in the same hall. There was a tall dark man with a pleasant baritone voice who only remembered the one verse of his song, but it was just as loudly applauded as if he had accomplished it all. I remember my mother and father taking part in a quartet. My father and also another man who was staying with us, played banjos.

Mother was at the piano and the Curate-in-charge played the flute. Now the flute is a difficult instrument to play and tune, and it was found that he could not get as high as the piano; a truly awful performance took place. My mother, quite conscious of the discordant jangle, went through the piece with clenched teeth and a moist brow. She said to my father "Never again!", but the three men had loved it being quite unmusical.

JESUS AND THE 5000 - A MODERN VERSION

Here the author of 'The Orthodox Heretic', Peter Rollins, gives us an updated version with another purpose in mind!

A Shocking Tale

Jesus withdrew privately by boat to a solitary place, but the crowds continued to follow him. Evening was approaching and the people, many who had travelled miles to hear him, were growing hungry.

Seeing this, Jesus sent his disciples out to gather food, but all they could find were five loaves and two fishes. Then Jesus asked his disciples to go out again to gather together the provisions the crowds had brought with them to sustain them on their travels. Soon a vast mountain of fish and bread stood before Jesus. He then directed the crowds to sit down on the grass.

Jesus then gave thanks to God and broke the bread, then passed the food among his disciples. Jesus and his friends were able to feast well into the night in full view of the starving people. What was amazing and truly miraculous was that once they had finished their massive banquet there were not even enough crumbs left to fill just one starving person's hand!

Peter Rollin's Commentary

What shocks us about this story is the way it inscribes such selfish and inhumane actions to Christ himself. While it would be perfectly acceptable to attack governments, corporations and individuals for such greedy, selfish behaviour it seems inappropriate to read such inhumane behaviour on to Christ himself.

Yet in the Bible we read that those who follow Christ are nothing less than the manifestation of his body in the world today (Col. 1:24, Cor.12:27 and Eph. 5:30). The presence of Christ in the world is said to be directly encountered in those who gather in his name. If so do we need to stop, draw breath and ask ourselves whether the above tale reflects how Christ is presented to the world today, at least in those who witness the lifestyle of Christians in the West!
