

DAVID'S DESPATCHES

WE ALL LOVE OUR PETS: We put ourselves out for them – often taking our dogs out for walks several times a day – and spoiling our cats rotten - judging by the exotic cat food adverts on the TV nowadays!

Sandy, the vicarage greyhound, loves going out for walks. How he behaves on walks has really changed over the last three years: now he sniffs round, plays with the other dogs, and chases about like a normal pet. He also pays much more attention to what's going on around him – before he hardly looked round and seemed petrified to do anything other than what you told him to! He's also got used to the rhythm of life in the vicarage – alert when we finish eating 'cos it's his turn next, and eyes flashing and tongue hanging out when Heather and I are on our day off. But whining when we haven't given him his lunch yet, and curled up on his bed when Sunday comes and we're both going to be out all morning. Even when we're both going, out he knows he can trust; that we care; that he is part of the family.

We love animals, so Heather and I are Stewarding the Dog Section at the **Gargrave Show** again at 1pm on Saturday 19th August – do come - lots of rosettes to be won! And we're having a **Family Pet Service** in church too – at 10.45 on Sunday 6th August at St Andrew's Gargrave, following the July one in Coniston Cold. Fun and blessings for the **whole** family... Pets are part of the family, aren't they. And they help us understand how God thinks about us too. God wants us to feel part of His family and part of the wider human family. Charity fund raising with blue hair!

July Meeting: 'Nights at the Old Music Hall.'

Our guest speaker for the evening was Chris Birch, who for our 'delectation and delight' gave us outrageous anecdotes and marvellous monologues from 'Nights at the Old Music Hall.' His desire for audience participation was quickly fulfilled when Chris, a director and actor at Skipton Little Theatre, informed us that his link with show business, and music hall in particular, was in the blood, as his father was part of a wartime acting troupe and his great uncle was Barney Colehan. 'Give him the money, Barney' came the cry from those of us who remembered Barney from 'Have a Go,' whilst others recalled the flamboyant, moustachioed producer of 'The Good Old Days.' But as we chuckled at the punchlines and sang snippets of all the old favourites, it became clear that the music hall tradition, in various guises, is still very much alive today.

The music hall's roots can be traced to industrial towns and cities in the 1840's when performers turned up at pubs to sing, dance or share their talents. From its working class roots, and driven by its popularity, theatres grew up and prospered, in spite of campaigns against them. By 1911 the Alhambras, Hippodromes, and Palaces could no longer be ignored and 'the other palace' came to call. The first Royal Command performance was held in 1912. Harry Lauder and many other great variety stars appeared but there was one glaring omission. Marie Lloyd was not invited as her routine was considered far too risqué to set before royalty. Clearly unimpressed and vastly wealthy herself, she hired a theatre down the road and declared that her sell-out performance that night was by the 'command of the British people.'

The development of the train network, the growth of local newspapers and the production of sheet music and cheap pianos drove the rise of the music hall. Nationwide train travel, and then global travel enabled the stars to have a worldwide presence. Sheet music was the precursor to radio in enabling songs to be 'heard' nationwide, and the production of cheap pianos meant that homes had the means to accompany the songs. The newspapers played their part as stars like Harry Houdini, realised the value of publicity stunts. On arrival in a town he routinely asked to be locked up, in their most ludicrously secure police cell. His miraculous escape was excitedly covered by the local press.

On certain nights, amateurs were invited to perform alongside the professionals. If any act was not going down well, the theatre manager in the wings with the aid of a long hook, dragged the sorry figure offstage. As Chris remarked, this would probably be welcomed, as depending on location a performer in those days received much more than judges' derisive comments. Preferred weaponry included steel rivets in Glasgow or rotten vegetables and dead cats in London. The 'chairman,' with his gavel and pulpit attempted to keep order but in some theatres the orchestra pit had to be covered by a wire cage to protect the long-suffering musicians from debris, as they desperately tried to put out a tune.

Many of the theatres have been demolished and many of the stars' routines have been lost as they were not recorded or considered too rude to write down. But in the costumed singalong screenings of popular musicals, 'Britain's Got Talent' and the Royal Variety performance the spirit of music hall lives on.

We all agreed with Pat Traves in her vote of thanks that we had indeed enjoyed an entertaining and interesting evening. Abbie White won the competition on the theme of a 'favourite theatre production.' For Abbie this was a local 'am-dram' production of 'Carousel' that she witnessed 'from the wings' when she was eight, 'Family and friends were transformed by costume and greasepaint... I saw excitement, stage fright, tears and egos flying. But when the waltz began and the lights went down, it was magic, a wonderful make-believe world.'

The overall theme was 'Botanicals.' The Co-operative Table team presented a card table featuring 'Happy Families' playing cards, designed and painted by Abbie White. Mr. Haberdashery, Mr. Flour and Mr. Chemist, aka Jean Maxwell,

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

IN MY LAST ARTICLE I SPOKE of the relief of the end of lambing and the cattle being outside. This was justified by June being a stockman's dream. Warm sunshine with the occasional wet day to keep the grass growing. The dairy farms had good weather for the first cut of silage and in some cases the second. It is a great relief to be able to cut at the stage of growth to ensure the best quality. It is seldom one can have good weather when the grass is ready. This year it proved to be excellent crops with sunshine to harvest (who says farmers always complain?)

In our own case as we have all the sheep at home for lambing we cut the meadows late. Slurry is then applied as



we move the sheep out of the meadows. It then takes six weeks before silage can be taken. However the feeds which were cleared early were made into haylage and baled for the sheep next winter. What a joy to make haylage of such quality.

There are always "ups and downs" in farming. The plan is to use single sexed semen on the diary heifers. Any which fail run with the Lim bull. However the first

heifer of the next batch in calf to sexed semen had a <u>bull</u> calf. To add insult to injury the heifer only had milk on 2 teats. As a result she joined the suckler cows with her Holstein bull calf.

The next dairy heifer to calve had a breach calving and smothered her calf. <u>This is farming</u>. You have to take the good with the bad and keep smiling. The next group of calving heifers are looking very promising but the dairy industry has been very volatile of late. It only takes the market to drop prices and the drop of a hat to cause havoc to our suppliers. When the supermarkets suddenly drop the price by two pence a litre it can make a huge difference at the month end as bills have to be paid.

At the moment there appears to be more optimism in the markets as supply and demand rule the eaves. New calved heifers are being required with calves and cull cows in demand, perhaps an improvement for dairy farms as they have been squeezed over the last couple of years (incidentally the number of dairy farms to cease milking and sell the cows tells its own story). I have yet to meet anyone who gave up milking cows who has started again.

June was a wonderful month in great surroundings. Being able to work as I want, shepherd with my own dogs or dry stone wall when the sun shines. Who has a better retirement?

PS. The White Park has calved this morning, a live heifer calf.

THE OLD DRAGON'S SKYDIVE FOR YORKSHIRE AIR AMBULANCE -17.6.17

THANK YOU so very much for sponsoring my skydive for YORKSHIRE AIR AMBULANCE. Thanks to your generosity we have raised (including gift aid) £2281. Congratulations and thanks to you all.

It was a perfect day for my skydive with blue skies, sunshine, and only a few puffs of cloud. Everyone at Cark Airfield (Near Grange Over Sands) were so friendly and relaxed, including my instructor Nicky Johnston, that I did not feel any anxiety or fear at all. It just seemed a natural thing to do. They seem to use and enjoy air as an element/medium ... much as swimmers use water.

First you are given instruction as to what is to happen, what to do etc. Then you are attached to what feels like an adult baby bouncer in the hanger to ensure you are able to get your knees and legs off the ground. You don't get to go up if

you can't. Then, fully equipped in the suit, harness and cap, you are escorted out to the plane on the runway. We were the first flight of the day and we were to be the first "out the door". Then it's time to scramble on board, before giving a jolly reassuring wave to the family. The instructor sits behind you on what looks like a forward



facing bench and the plane takes off leaving terra firma behind ... hopefully not forever!

The altimeter strapped to the back of Nicky's hand indicates how high you are climbing and it takes about fifteen minutes to reach 14,500 feet. Just before you get there you sit on the instructor's knees while the harness is tightened up at the four points which attach you to him, checked by the video man, the goggles go over the glasses and you are ready to go!

THIS IS NOT THE POINT AT WHICH TO HAVE A CHANGE OF MIND!!!!!!!

The 'up and over' perspex door is opened and your video cameraman climbs out and stands on a ledge OUTSIDE the plane at 14,500' – in order to film your exit! You don't actually leap out, you just topple out over the side and out into the beautiful blue yonder! (Your legs are already tucking themselves under the fuselage so they are in the right position as you free-fall.) The world below is a patchwork of estuary, villages, wood and fields, all rather small, like a painting on a wall, not quite real. A small parachute opens right away which stabilizes you as you free-fall (I didn't feel as if I was falling) for a couple of minutes, the video man, still with you, filming your fall.





afterwards I realized that there must have been a 'DON'T' at the beginning of the sentence, but my ears had been affected by the descent.

All in all it was a terrific experience and one I can't wait to do again. Do try it – it's great fun!

LOCAL HERITAGE DEVELOPMENTS – STIRTON WITH THORLBY

Neighbouring Parish, Stirton With Thorlby, is proposing to renovate their village stocks which are thought to be between 300 and 400 years old.

Stocks were used from medieval times as a form of punishment for minor offences and traditionally faced the nearest Church so that the wrong-doers could most easily pay penance for their wrong-doing. Although there is no record of the last official use of stocks in Stirton, the "Loose Leaves of Craven History" printed in 1906 mentions that "The latest records in Skipton of stocks used as a mode of punishment was April 16th 1733, 'for taking up a man and setting him in ye stocks – 2s. Od'. It continues, "Sunday was apparently the usual day for their use. During a certain stage in the morning church service, the Churchwardens of the town, and county parishes, would solemnly rise, leave their seats in church, and headed by the old Beadle in cocked hat and official coat trimmed with old lace, and carrying his trident headed staff of office, would perambulate the town and 'run in' anyone found either drunk or drinking in a public house."

The stocks in Stirton used to abut the bridge over the beck of the original toll road to Thorlby at the Stirton crossroads and were often left submerged in silt from the beck. The structure, comprising of two stone uprights and a stone bottom rail with indents for two pairs of ankles side by side, was moved by local Councillor Derek Swinglehurst in the 1960s, prior to their listing, with the help of two young boys who were residents of the village at the time who both still live nearby today. The boys had no idea there was a bottom rail to the structure, so submerged in silt was this part, but this move undoubtedly saved the stocks from further dilapidation. The wooden top rail, likely to have originally been of English oak, is missing, presumed rotten away. The top rail would have been joined to the bottom via a chain, long enough to allow the top rail to lift up, ankles to have been placed in the carved out area of the bottom rail of stone, lowered and padlocked shut for the duration of the appropriate penance. English folklore has it that rotten vegetables would have been thrown at those incarcerated in the stocks as a further humiliation.

CONNECTING WITH CULTURE

In the wake of London's fire

"...Or those who died.... do you think they were more guilty than all the others? (Luke 13: 4)

It can be earthquakes... floods... terrorism, or – as in the case of London so tragically on June 12th - a terrible fire disaster at Grenfell tower block. The question 'Why?" is inevitably on our minds. My own mind goes back to another account of a tower disaster, recorded in the Bible. 18 people had died when Jerusalem's Tower of Siloam had fallen on them. This tragedy – following the wicked killing of other innocents under the despotic Pontius Pilate – was causing citizens in Jerusalem to come to Jesus, with the same question – 'Why?'

The Lord's answer to His questioners does not lessen our distress at calamities here in London. But - though deeply grieved - we are not so shocked that we are completely devoid of understanding.

For Scripture teaches us that adversity is firmly built into a Christian view of life on this earth:

1. We are all living in a fallen world. Our present world-order is not as originally created. Basically, we became a race of rebels, fallen from our custodianship over Creation – so bringing both ourselves and the Creation itself into the frustration of 'bondage to decay' (Romans 8:18-23). Even the ground was affected (Genesis 3:17,18). In our imperfection, judgements are faulty. Mistakes are made. Accidents take place, in which innocent people are both hurt and killed.

2. We are all living in a temporary home. When questioned in the face of Jerusalem's tower disaster, Jesus explained that those killed were no more 'guilty' to die, than anyone else. But His words give the warning: whenever and however it happens, it is inevitable that all of us will die one day. We should give thought to that, and prepare ourselves in all humility.

3. We are all living on borrowed time. Jesus went on to speak of a fruitless fig tree (Luke 13: 6-9). Should it be cut down? No, give it a year's reprieve. The lesson was clear. None of us can consider that this life is ours forever. We are all living, if you like, under a reprieve. We do not know when our particular time will come to an end. We need to consider how best to use the life we have now. This leads to a final truth:

4. We are all living as debtors to love. People hung on Jesus' words because they knew that He had solid answers for this world's sorrows. Indeed, He was the answer, for at the Cross we meet the love of the suffering God Himself. One prayer must be that, out of the trauma of London's present troubles, there will be both helpers and sufferers themselves who experience this, and respond.
