

DAVID'S DESPATCHES

Revd David Houlton

CHRISTMAS IS ALMOST HERE and despite the protestations of my more ecclesiologically-inclined colleagues, we will be putting up Christmas trees and starting Christmas celebrations from Sunday 3rd December.

Strictly speaking that is actually the first Sunday of Advent – when we start thinking about God coming to visit His people – both as a human baby 2000 years ago and, in the future, when He comes to judge the world (or, like so many generations before us, when we go to meet Him after this life is over). So there is an interesting mixture of themes in Church Services in the weeks running up to Christmas. On the one hand it is a joyful celebration of life – the new life of a newborn baby child who will bring blessing to everyone who will receive Him. On the other hand there is the reminder that we are responsible for how we live our lives; will we love God, and will we love our neighbour as we love ourselves?

Fortunately, as the life of Jesus shows, God is hoping to "catch us in" rather than "catch us out". In other words, Jesus came to save us, not to condemn us. He came to die, so that we could be forgiven when we do wrong and could have eternal life (in our hearts in this life, and completely in the next). That experience, almost like new life, is something that several people have had this year. It is an amazing thing to realise that God actually loves you, and **wants** you to be with Him – now and forever. So, although we should never forget the judgement theme of Advent – because our life choices are important, celebration is rightfully the overriding theme in the run up to Christmas.

And there will be **a lot** of celebrating going on again this year – including two performances of the traditional Gargrave Nativity. Full details below:

- <u>Sunday 3rd, 10.45</u>: **Family Advent Service** (breakfast available from 10am) and the start of the village "Posada"- in church. Posada is a tour of the village by a lovely nativity set of the Holy Family in search of a place for Jesus to be born, finishing in St Andrew's at the Christingle Service at 4pm on Christmas Eve. Sign up in church to host the Posada for a day and reflect on the eternal truths behind Christmas.
- <u>Sunday 3rd, 4.30pm:</u> **Village Lights switch-on** with carol singing *at the Summerseat.* Followed by mulled wine and mince pies etc.
- <u>Saturday 9th, 4.30pm:</u> The matinee performance of the **Gargrave Nativity** at St Andrew's.
- <u>Sunday 10th, 4.30pm:</u> The Gargrave Nativity Service performed and sung by people from across Gargrave every Christmas since the 1950s.
- Sunday 17th, 10.45: A Kings College style "Service of Lessons and Carols" by candelight at St Andrew's.
- <u>Sunday 17th, 7pm:</u> **Christmas Carol Service** with the Giggleswick Brass Band, at St Peter's Coniston Cold.

- Monday 18th, 2.30pm: Carol singing at Milton House and then on to Neville House.
- Thursday 21st, 1.30pm: School Christmas Service in St Andrew's.
- <u>Christmas Eve, 4pm:</u> The annual **Christingle Service** in aid of the Children's Society.
- <u>Christmas Eve, 11.30pm:</u> A traditional "Midnight Mass" to see in Christmas Day (bells start at 11pm)
- <u>Christmas Day, 10am:</u> Christmas Communion at St Peter's Coniston Cold
- Christmas Day, 11am: Christmas Communion at St Andrew's Gargrave
- Christmas Day, 12.30: Christmas Dinner (contact 078 62 23 16 91).

Christmas is a time to celebrate, to join together, and to reconnect with family and community and God. Heather and I are very thankful that we are able to enjoy this Christmas with everyone in Gargrave and Coniston Cold and, as we move to Ireland in the New Year, we will look back with thankful hearts for our time in such lovely church and village communities.

May your all your Christmases be meaningful celebrations, and blessed by God.

Hopefully you've all visited the newly refurbished Library and are impressed with the transformation; again thanks go to everybody who worked hard to ensure the success of the project.

Much to our surprise and joy the Library was named as NYCC Library of the Month in September which is a reflection on the dedication of our Volunteers, the success of the Summer Reading Challenge and our performance against the targets set each year by NYCC. Thank you all.

Every so often we start to run short of Volunteers and we are approaching the time when two or three more Volunteers would ease the load and ensure that the Library can continue to operate.

Volunteers usually work a 3 hour shift with two volunteers per shift. Most Volunteers do about one shift a month. Others will not do a shift for a couple of months others two shifts a month. How many shifts and when you do a shift is entirely up to you. We operate a web-based booking system so, at any time of the day, you can see which slots are available and, if any are convenient, enter your name.

News from the bell tower: Open day

For local residents, parishioners and passers by the sound of the bells cannot be ignored, especially on Monday practice nights, but few will have had the opportunity to see what goes on behind the scenes. We hope to rectify this by arranging an Open Day one Saturday afternoon towards the end of January in the lull between Christmas and Easter. So please look out for notices.

We hope to show a short video in the church before escorting small groups, perhaps no more than two or three, to the ringing chamber in the tower for a demonstration and explanation by some of our experienced ringers. We can explain how the mechanisms work and how the bells are controlled and you will hear some of the names and terms used only in bell ringing. Unfortunately, for safety reasons, the tour will be restricted to observing and asking questions but for anyone taking an interest in taking part, we would be pleased to arrange a separate session for tuition.

In addition to safety in the ringing chamber, there is the safety of access to consider. At St Andrew's the 500 year old steps are now well worn. Plans are in hand to improve the handrail but climbing the steps can be a bit of a challenge for some. We will ensure that there are plenty of helpers to escort visitors on the open day; also to supply them with a cup of coffee, or tea and cake!

The bellringers would also like to wish everyone the very best for the Christmas Season and thank Vicar David for his help and support. We have already made arrangements for ringing on Christmas Eve and hope that we can continue with increasing numbers and expertise for the New Year.

Church tower: urgent repairs

As many in the village know, a bid was made earlier this year for funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund towards the cost of certain repairs to the tower of St, Andrew's church and certain alterations to the interior of the church following on from the completion of the new kitchen. Unfortunately this bid has recently been rejected. The PCC continues to work very closely with members of the Heritage Group. The advice they have taken recently from two structural engineers is that **urgent repairs** are required in particular to one of the finials (pointed bits sticking up from the edge of the top of the tower) which is twisting. If the finial was to fall from the tower outwards it would endanger life and limb and if it was to fall inwards it would be likely to damage the organ very seriously. Further advice is being sought as to whether there has been further deterioration in this and as to whether, for example, fencing should be placed as soon as possible around the vulnerable part of the churchyard next the tower because of the urgency of the situation.

4 A quote of just under £100,000 (including VAT) has been obtained for the work to undertake a full repair of the finials and castellations affected. This includes some £28,000 (including VAT) for the hire of a cherry picker and scaffolding. It may be possible for the cost of the overall project to be reduced if, instead of full repairs, a temporary repair involving supporting the affected areas with a scaffolding collar is undertaken and the cost of this is being investigated but whatever action is taken the cost of the scaffolding and cherry picker will be inescapable.

Currently it is anticipated that the VAT element of these costs will be recoverable but this will no longer be the case for any expenditure incurred after a date during 2020.

The £100,000 referred to above includes some £8,400 for repairs required to the staircase in the tower leading to the bell ringing chamber.

When the updated advice has been received the PCC will be in a position to advise the village of the facts, to consider what funds are required and how they might be raised. As part of this it is anticipated that an appeal will be made for funds by the delivery in the coming weeks of envelopes to all households in the village.

Last month I asked for questions that readers might have about life, the universe and everything and below are some answers to the questions I've received and others that many of us have. I hope you will find them helpful.. or at least thought provoking! If anything below touches a raw nerve, or provokes you to want to talk in more depth, please feel free to contact me (details in the front cover)

Right, wrong and meaning. Before tackling such questions, it is important to think about why we ask questions about right, wrong and meaning. As human

beings we don't just accept the way things are in the world around us, and we don't just trust everyone we meet, or believe everything we are told. We want to understand. Or at least we should!

So, here's the key conundrum: why do we feel there is something wrong with the way things are in this world? It has always been like this! There have always been disasters, dangers, sickness, wars and death. So why do we feel there is something wrong with them? And why do we feel it's wrong that we can't trust everyone we meet? Why do we feel it's wrong that we can't believe everything we are told? Since human life began it has always been the case that people cheat, and steal, and deceive, and abuse other people.

The feeling that something is wrong, although it's always been like that, is one of the conundrums of human life. How do we know how the world should be, when in reality it has never been like that? How do we know how people should be - when in reality everyone has not lived up to it? The reality is that our world has always been dangerous, and human beings have always acted badly. But we don't just accept it – we know that things shouldn't be like this! So we want to build a better world: we want to care for the environment, we want justice and equality; we want peace; we want everyone to have homes that can stand up to earthquakes and storms; we want better hygiene and medicines for all; we want to build loving families and communities; and we want generous support people who are poor and homeless... (but do we want to pay for all that)?

That conundrum is the source of many people's questions about Life, God and Everything, such as:

Why does God permit so much suffering? Because the only way to get rid of suffering would be to get rid of this world... and us! We couldn't live in a perfect world, because we ourselves aren't perfect (if we were in that world it would be imperfect)!

So what is God doing about all the suffering? God's response wasn't to try to make this world perfect and take away our free will, but to get personally involved in the mess, difficulties and suffering of this world! As we remember at Christmas, when Jesus came into this world He wasn't born into a perfect world. He was born to a young working class couple, in a smelly stable, and laid in a manger. The local King tried to have him killed, so His family had to flee and eventually move back to a safer part of the country. His mother was widowed young. During the three years Jesus taught and ministered to the sick and needy, the civil and religious authorities treated Jesus with suspicion and hostility. And, of course, He was eventually persecuted, prosecuted, beaten and nailed to a cross.

Yet a few days later He was alive again. His followers spoke and ate with Him. And after He went back to heaven, His Spirit came to live in His followers' hearts and lives. Heaven was in their hearts, and they were so inspired that they took His presence, and taught His Way, from country to country - despite being denounced, persecuted and punished. He was alive; death is not the end; we can be forgiven and accepted by God; God is with us! And He still wants to be involved in our lives - with us through the highs and lows of life on planet earth. This world isn't heaven, and we aren't angels, but His response is *forgiveness*, *presence* and

help. He will be with us now, and after this life we will be with Him forever, if we will come to Him and follow Him.

Why do we need to be forgiven? Because to make us fit for that perfect world (aka heaven) we need to be made perfect. Our past has to be forgiven and forgotten, and we have to be changed.

Aren't all religions the same really? Hardly. That was a rather naïve assertion that became popular in the 1960's when most people knew very little about other religions. It's not the same God behind every religion! After all, each religion has its own worldview, and different understandings of the human condition, of God (or gods) and of how we can live a good life at peace with God, with each other, with ourselves, and with the world we live in. I used to be involved in interfaith work in Manchester and it quickly became evident that we all wanted to respect each other, and to build up good relationships and mutual understanding, but it was also evident that it meant understanding and working with real differences which had serious implications (eg What can we eat together: anything? not pork? not beef? nothing?! Is converting to another religion a serious betrayal of your family? Should men and women talk together, or not?)

So what does God look like? The universe we are part of was created by God. He isn't part of it, so we can't possibly 'see' God physically. But we do know what God is like: loving, joyful, peaceable, patient, kind, good, faithful, gentle and self-controlled. That is what Jesus was like, and that is what God wants us to become like too.

Hasn't Science made Christianity irrelevant? No! They answer different problems. Science is about how life and the universe function, whereas Christianity is about the meaning of life and the universe. Some of the world's top scientists are followers of Jesus. For instance Professor Sir Colin Humphreys, CBE, FREng, FRS (a Director of Research into semiconductors among other things, at Cambridge University), Professor R J Berry, FRSE (a geneticist), Professor D C Burke, CBE, Honlld, DL (who worked on interferon, and advises adviser to the House of Commons Select Committee on Science and Technology), and Professor J C Lennox PhD (Cantab) DPhil (Oxon) who is Emeritus Professor of Mathematics at Oxford University, and a specialist in Bioethics.

Is following Jesus realistic in the 21st century? Yes, because His Way is the right way to live! When we live the wrong way we are actually contributing to the problems of this world and the problems of people around us. What's more, as many of us have discovered, Jesus can actually help us to live life better. Life in this world will never be perfect (though my experience is that He has improved my life a lot)... but even in the horrible times of life on planet earth, God is with us in it.

What's the point of going to church? Jesus-with-us is the key to Christian living. However, in this imperfect world we need each other for encouragement and support. Meeting other followers helps us to strengthen our trust in Jesus, and to keep up our commitment to living the right way. That is what church should be for; but sadly, like this world, and us, no church is perfect!

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

A conversation with the Revd David Houlton revealed his coming move to Ireland. We wish him well but will be a loss to Gargrave and especially to the show committee for his great work for the dog show.

It was his move to Ireland and our conversation about my longstanding association with an Irish farmer in my youth that gave me the idea for this article.

A certain Pat Quinn from Attimass in County Mayo, in the northwest of Ireland, along with many colleagues, came to Skipton to hire for haytime. The first time I met Pat was in 1943. He came the last Monday in June for the traditional hay month. Haytime of course was all by hand with horses. Most farms in the area would hire one or more for the hay month. The bargain was all hours for a set sum, and if hay was complete before the four weeks they could move on with full pay. If hay was not finished, a new agreement for an extra week or more would be arranged. Pat became part of the family. He came every year for years. In a bad year, he would stop six weeks. While he was here at Scaleber, he would be in contact with arable farms in Lincolnshire regarding harvest. If corn was ready, Pat was gone. If it was not quite ripe, he would head for the Hawes area for a couple of weeks haytime.

At the end of the war, combines were only starting and most farmers were using binders. Corn sheaves were then stooked (stood on en on end) in stacks of eight to dry. After drying, it was carted into stacks by horse and cart to await threshing. It took a lot of manpower and hard work by hand.

Once onto the larger arable farms, Pat would form a team who made a contract to clear the fields, see the threshing completed, then move on. As a team, they fed themselves and worked all hours. Pat always referred to this as "piece work". The faster they worked, more money was earned. It must have been hard as when you are in a team, you are expected to keep up, or you were out – simple as that. A little Irish skill was exhibited here. As Pat said, if the crop was light, a contract per acre was an advantage. If a heavy crop, a price per ton was on the cards.

The team then moved on to potato picking, which really was a back-breaking job. After potatoes, came pulling turnips and making pies, not vegetable pies, but building piles of turnips and covering them with straw and soil to protect from frost. At that time, cattle food was scarce and turnips were one of the most important feeds. I spent many days in potato and turnip fields during the 40s and 50s. It was a tough job in bad weather with a horse and cart – not one of the most exciting jobs on a farm. We were very grateful for the work these Irish men did. Theirs was a hard life, as most had small farms in the west. The came over in June and only returned just before Christmas, leaving their wives to look after the home holding.

Pat was a remarkable man; he brought four sons to spend their first hay month at Scaleber. As he said, it broke them gently into the work pattern, on good food for starters. He kept in touch all his life. Despite a hard life, smoking twist all his life and pints of beer, he lived into his 90s. I have visited the village Pat

lived in: stone houses and burning peat. It does bring into context how the potato famine must have been horrendous. Pat ended his days back in County Mayo. His sons remained in England and his daughters nursing in Leeds. Good memories of a likeable man.

"ESSENTIAL SELF" LAUNCHED TO COMBAT EMOTIONAL WELLBEING ISSUES

World Mental Health Day recently saw the launch of a new mental health service in the Craven area.

An initiative by qualified mental health nurse, Emma Davies, Essential Self provides an alternative to traditional counselling and coaching, offering an initial analysis, overview of available therapies and a suggested route to better emotional wellbeing based on each individual patient's specific needs.



Operating from Gargrave, Emma works with clients to tackle commonly experienced areas of difficulty such as depression, anxiety, stress, anger and low self-esteem. Often these manifest themselves in problematical behaviours

which can impact on family members, including alcohol and drug abuse, and eating disorders.

Emma explains "Many private practitioners specialise in one form of therapy only, but in many cases clients can implement their own coping mechanisms to start their recovery and may benefit from taking elements from different therapies rather than just one. I work with patients to explore treatment options that suit their own issues rather than attempting to pigeon hole all their symptoms in one box."



The new service gives clients the chance to be themselves without fear of being seen as ill, broken or faulty and focuses on developing strategies to harness their own abilities and internal strengths in order to move forwards in life, overcoming many of the issues challenging them.

Acting as a 'life strategist' (a term coined by a client), Emma aims to offer affordable help for people to access emotional wellbeing assistance outside an over-stretched NHS, where only limited support is available.



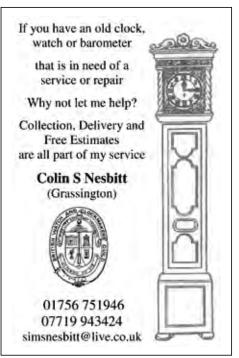


