


FIRST WORDS

In the absence of a vicar we have introductory messages from a variety of sources both within the parish and from the wider world. This month's contribution is from Neil Goddard of the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity.

The God who befriends

Better is open rebuke than hidden love. Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses. Proverbs 27:5-6

As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another. Proverbs 27:17 I remember it really clearly: stood in the kitchen of my student house, clutching a cup of tea, and being told - in no uncertain terms - that I needed to be kinder with my words. The deliverer of this stark truth was someone I had met only once before, but who had been invited for dinner by one of my housemates.

In that moment, I knew three things.

Firstly, I was cross. What right did this person have to offer up opinions and rebuke me when they'd only just met me?

Secondly, they were right: I frequently used words as weapons rather than gifts, and they weren't the first person to call me out on it. But – strangely enough - they were the first person I listened to.

Thirdly, we were going to be friends. This realisation surprised me, but I knew it with a deep certainty. And I was right - three years later, they're one of my closest friends.

This story is a worked example of these proverbs, and an illustration of how friendship isn't meant to be consistently comfortable and cosy. True friendship does not shrink from correcting the friend - after all, iron cannot sharpen iron unless forceful contact is made.

These proverbs assume that a friend persists and does not shy away from constructive criticism. Such criticism is done in a way which is open and direct, remaining caring and completely concerned with the best interests of the addressee. Does this ring true for your friendships? Or does it present you with a challenge?

Friendship is a key part of life and so, for the Christian, a key part of discipleship. Through friendship, God teaches us about others, about community, and about Himself. After all. He is the God who calls us friend.

So, what does it mean to be a friend? Each friendship will take a different form, depending on the people engaging in it. Colleagues, family, fellow parents, study partners... wherever we are, whatever we're doing, friends will most likely play a part.

Friendships are significant, presenting us with opportunities for both evangelism and discipleship, as well as for learning more about God, and they are a part of life where we can see God working powerfully - in us and through us, every day.

This is not simply a day of prayer for women, but for everyone who cares about our world and those who live in it.




Play: The Visitors -2 Mar

A beginner in the bell tower

When I went to the bell tower earlier this year to have my first go at bell ringing I really didn't know what to expect. The experience reminded me a bit of learning to drive. Initially you are responsible for something big, heavy and potentially dangerous and you don't really know what you're doing. Fortunately, you have the bell equivalent of dual controls with Malcolm right at your side to keep things running smoothly and to only give you as much control as you can deal with. It was a big moment for me when I was brave enough to ring without Malcolm at my side.

Controlling a bell is also like getting to grips with clutch control on a car. You need to find that biting point when the bell is at the balance, once you can do that and hold it there then you are in control of the bell, and suddenly you are a bell ringer - and what a great feeling that is. I am now at the stage where I can ring in rounds with the other ringers of the tower, and I can swap places with other ringers to create patterns. This means that I can now ring on a Sunday morning. I rarely stay for the service, it is not a requirement of the ringers and I am just an

occasional church goer. I do like being part of a proud and ancient tradition and I feel that I am making a contribution to the fabric of the village.

Learning to ring the bells has given me a great sense of achievement and I genuinely enjoy the activity of ringing as well as the camaraderie of the tower and the trip to the pub afterwards. There are many more challenges ahead of me but I'll deal with those when I get to them.

Swan Update

I am pleased to say that over the festive period she has put on weight, and by the time this report is read, hopefully she will have been released back into the wild.

The Yorkshire Swan & Wildlife Rescue Hospital (see advert) was busy over Christmas treating injuries to swans caused by dogs and by being shot at! Dog owners exercising their dogs on the canal towpath should put their dogs on leads if they encounter swans as they can be aggressive if frightened.

The hospital, which is run entirely by volunteers, is desperate for food and other help. If any reader is able to help, please see the advert for details.



Early December saw temperatures plummet to well below freezing on several days and nights, when the canal was frozen. Several swans were seen sleeping on the ice at Bank Newton and holes were seen in the ice where some swans must have become trapped as the water froze. These holes were surrounded by feathers which suggests that they were able to escape, with some difficulty!

In cold weather swans are vulnerable. If out walking on the canal take some wholemeal bread (not white as this damages their livers) to feed them, this will help them survive.

And so had Chris, who could be forgiven for squirming in his seat as we smiled sweetly at pictures of him there as a baby. It was Annie's first time.

If the family had simply flown to Australia, they would have missed out on the many opportunities to meet local people, stay with families, taste local food, and practise foreign languages, not just in Europe but in Russia, Mongolia, China, Hong Kong, Thailand and Singapore. And we in turn, at the Village Hall, got to see much more than the 'holiday snaps'. We got to feel what it must be like travelling on the same train for ten days (although Chris never demonstrated his time-passing game of 'Toss the Teabag'). We experienced the relief of a two-day

stopover in the beautiful countryside near Irkutsk. We met the people who became important to our family both on the journey and at the final destination: two nomadic Mongolian farmers, the Aboriginal hitch-hiker on his way to a funeral, the coach driver known as Grasshopper, and last but not least relative Auntie Sheila.

At the Village Hall we got to hear the sounds in rainforests, and experienced Annie and Chris searching for wildlife at night (not Oscar-worthy performances, but...) We were there with Bee as she joined in Tai Chi at a park in China. We saw the clothing and equipment for the journey (did Duncan really wear the same shirt every day?). We felt Annie's pain when she nearly lost her pet kangaroo that had travelled the whole journey as well (not a real one: no animals were harmed.....!)

Leaving the Village Hall to walk home, safely within our comfort zones, maybe there was a feeling of sadness: "If only I had done something like this". It was impossible not to feel envious of Annie and Chris, that they had already experienced so much at their young age. But maybe it's never too late. So next time you are online, booking that long haul flight or a five-star hotel.....

FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

Iohn Hall

Having survived Christmas, it's been a very busy time on the farm (did someone say it was a holiday?) On a stock farm, there is no let up. This year, it was partly due to sudden changes in the weather: being very warm and muggy, then suddenly cold and windy, causing pneumonia in cattle and sheep, with liver fluke to contend with too.

After a good summer and sileage time, the autumn became very wet with the autumn grass poor quality. This affects every type of stock, and means having to buy in extra feed to finish lambs and beef stock

Due to a poor harvest, the prices have risen. Straw has gone up 30%, fertiliser 25%, energy buckets (mineral and feed supplements) 8 %, wheat and barley 15%. On the bright side, lamb, beef and turkeys have remained promising.

This is the way farming has always been, with highs and lows. One has to be resilient and battle on. December has always been a hard month. Having seen picking sprouts and cauliflowers on an arable farm on a cold wet morning for the Christmas trade, I decided our lot is not like that - as much of ours is in buildings.

Strangely, none of our cows calved over Christmas. The next batch of heifers are now due and look very promising. The young new-born calves are placed into single pens for individual attention. It is amazing how quickly they grow and need more space, dehorning and ear tagging is time consuming. As the heifers calve and move on, the next batch move up into the larger cubicles, allowing each group to move up in the chain, allowing the single pens to be available as new calves are born. One always tries to find a calm period in the weather to change round, as it involves cleaning out and disinfecting.

It is now time to give attention to the lambing ewes in preparation for spring. Lambing is a pleasure providing the ewes are in good condition. By the time you read this the days will be longer and the snowdrops out. Some cold dry days would be appreciated.

The hedges and plantings we made provide cover for the wildlife. The robins are in good bloom, as are three woodpeckers. The resident pheasants are wintering well. (I keep saying to them "Hang about – the shooting season's nearly over!")

I spoke to friends in New Zealand where drought is very serious. The land is like a desert and there is a possibility of a cull of cattle on the cards.

Those who market products for us to consume (even space-saving "storage solutions") want us to see space as something to fill – preferably with whatever they sell. Yet God is present in the space. We can ask our Lord, in prayer, to change our attitude towards the space in our home, so we see space as a valuable commodity, something to use creatively and to enjoy.

Again, the Psalmist thanks God because: 'You gave me a wide place for my steps under me, and my feet did not slip.' Psalm 18:36

Once we are set free from the burden of constantly having to sort and maintain our overflow of possessions, there will be room and time to use the creative gifts that God has given to you. What are your gifts? Baking, dancing, growing vegetables, painting, storytelling, wood carving? – the list of possibilities is endless.

Look closely at the things in your house. Does each possession help you in using your God-given gifts, or slow you down by encumbering you? Aim to be set free from them for CREATIVITY, to be like our Creator God, enjoying the freedom of a simplified, uncluttered life, with time freed for what is most important.

Monthly meeting 7-15 pm, Monday 8 January 2018

The assembled group of Parish, District and County Councillors and villagers were welcomed and wished a Happy New Year by the Chairman, Peter Ward.

It was agreed to get quotes for repairs to or replacement of the hand dryer in the Gents Public toilets. Cty Cllr Quinn offered to look at helping with the cost by using some of this year's grant money which she has not yet allocated. She also told the meeting that the NYCC Skibeden Household Waste Recycling Centre will have electrical goods recycling facilities for 2018/19.

Both Cty Cllr Quinn and Dist Cllr Myers wanted the Parish Council to stress to residents that "PLASTIC BAGS AND SOFT PLASTIC FILM ARE NOT TO GO INTO THE BLUE BINS" as these products contaminate the loads.

Dist Cllr Myers reported that it is conceivable that a bypass for Gargrave might be reconsidered.

The Police Report included information compiled by our most recent PCSO, Emily Hewitson, as well as a total for North Yorkshire's crime figures for 2017. These are the figures she has provided for us:

01/01/2016 – 01/01/2017 285 reports in total, 53 Crimes reported: 7 violence, 8 theft, 14 criminal damage, 13 burglaries, 11 auto crimes.

01/01/2017 to end 2017: 294reports in total, 47 Crimes reported;

13 violence, 9 theft, 7 criminal damage, 5 burglaries, 13 auto crimes.

Comparing 2017 with 2016., there was nearly a doubling of violence, almost halving of criminal damage, and more than halving of burglaries.

Road speeding matters were discussed, and the Parish Council repeated its request for volunteers from the village, who will be given training, to be part of a team to use speed guns and record speeding vehicles. 


