

This month's introductory message is from Neil Goddard of the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity.

#### Little big things

Oxfam. Harvey Weinstein. Larry Nassar. The Presidents Club. Barry Bennell. #MeToo.

Whether it's prostitutes in Haiti or young gymnasts in training, the sexual abuse accusations just keep appearing. Large scale scandals that shock our society. 'How is this still happening in 2018?!' people ask. 'This is a blight on society', they say. They're right. It is a blight on society. And there are many reasons why it is still happening.

One of these reasons is collusion. Whether on a massive scale, like the accusations levelled at Michigan State University in the Larry Nassar case, or on a smaller scale, where safequarding procedures are overlooked, friends protected, or victims not believed, collusion is everywhere.

It's in our businesses. Our workplaces. Our supply chains. Even, I'm ashamed to say, in our churches.

If you're anything like me, you'll think that scandals happen 'out there'. You, like me, will be convinced that if you were to come across anything illegal or ethically questionable, you would immediately put a stop to it. Blow the whistle. Tell someone.

Except it's rarely that simple, and most big scandals – like everything else – are made up of a collection of smaller choices. One decision at a time.

So, what if the smallest decisions of our daily lives were actually forming us the most?

One click. One purchase. One email. One word. One promise. One lie.

It adds up.

It's likely that most of us reading this won't be faced with big choices about disclosing large-scale abuse scandals.

But we will make decisions about where we bank, and how we spend our money. We will make snap choices about whether to speak up or remain silent.

What if the smallest decisions of our daily lives were actually forming us the most?

Act justly. Love mercy. Walk humbly with your God.

Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves.

Judge fairly.

Defend the rights of the poor and needy.

Look after widows and orphans in their distress.

Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God.

In small decisions as in anywhere else, this is our true and proper worship.

#### **NSPCC Soup Lunch Thanks**



#### Betty's Charity Stall

This time last year I was pleased to announce that the Charity stall I run alongside my own Collectables stall at the Village Hall Flea Markets had raised the sum of £320 for Manorlands Hospice at Oxenhope. My hope for 2017 was to try and increase the amount raised to a nice round sum of £500. Through kind donations of goods combined with lots of purchases I am delighted to say that I was personally able to deliver £558, to the Sue Ryder home in January, far exceeding my expectations.

The donation will help to support people living with conditions like cancer, heart failure and lung disease. The Hospice offers a range of support from inpatient care to day services that allow people to stay at home longer and provide respite for Carers. The Sue Ryder home needs £2.1m each year to be able to continue to provide these services so each and every gift is a vital contribution.

My charity stall is known to many Villagers as "Betty's stall". Betty raised generous amounts over many years for Oncology research at Airedale hospital and when she moved to Milton House I continued to run the stall, as I knew what an important part of her life it had been. I decided to contribute to Manorlands after friends had been cared for there.

Betty spent her latter years in comfort and was very happy at Milton House, saying she was treated like Royalty! Sadly, she died on Christmas Eve and her funeral took place at Gargrave on the 11th January. She was a lovely lady who, despite poor health, enjoyed life to the full. She married Londoner Alf LeGassick later in life and they spent sixteen very happy years together. Betty had travelled extensively (she met Alf on one of her many coach tours) but thought there was no finer place than Gargrave. Betty never complained about anything and one of her favourite words to describe something that was good or enjoyable was "It's Magic!". She would have been delighted to know that the target sum of £500 had been exceeded and I can see her with a twinkle in her eye saying "That's' Magic!"

#### In Google we trust?

WHAT DO YOU DO WHEN you don't know something? Simple, Google it.

Google is the place we go to solve debates in the pub, ensure we don't look incompetent at work, and even discover the meaning of life.

Alongside this, something else has been happening. Google has become the closest thing the West has had to an all-knowing, all-powerful being since it believed in God. Because everything you do is tracked, recorded, and analysed.

Google knows so much. Then there is Facebook, Amazon, Netflix, Tinder etc., who know all your entertainment, spending, and romantic preferences.

The mountains of data of human behaviour that tech giants possess has given them unparalleled insights into how individuals actually behave. Moreover, they have used this data to direct and alter our behaviour.

Today, people often engage in politics via a newsfeed algorithm, which is designed to entertain us enough to keep us scrolling, so we can be advertised to. Nuance doesn't keep us scrolling. Fake news and one-sided rants do.

So that's what dominates our newsfeeds. Not because tech giants have an agenda to promote it. They have merely learned what human beings actually do. They then profit from giving the people what they want: clickable-fake-newsrants. Their god-like knowledge is in the data they gather and it allows them to see our unsanitised digital behaviour.

It's not pretty: we insult people using words we would never say to their face. We only encounter people who think like us, and mock 'others' whilst hidden behind screens. We make our lives look great for the dopamine buzz of 'likes'; masking and feeding our insecurity and anxiety.

Algorithms haven't **made** us like this. The digital world has just freed us to express our existing selfishness, insecurity, and hatred by removing many of the social ramifications of expressing our ugliness. Human nature hasn't changed.

So, what do we do? Accepting I'm an ugly mess was the first step I made to become a Christian. I didn't need unparalleled data to know what my faith has always claimed was true. I'm flawed and the root of that is emphatically not technology.

The challenge is to see our own brokenness, seek forgiveness, and join in God's redeeming work. What does that look like in technology? Probably much like it does for the rest of life: people dying to themselves; loving their enemies; and inspiring faith and hope in others.

It was the time of the Munich disaster. My father and I had finished milking. Mother was in hospital. We went in for breakfast, when we heard a knock on the door. Outside, was a small boy with large rimmed glasses. He introduced himself: "I'm Jim Horner, I've come to live at Paradise Cottages, Marton Road, I'm 10 years old and looking for a job!!!"

He wasn't shy at speaking up, as he informed us his father was Bunt Horner, the rugby player, his mother was not well, and he wanted to be a farmer. We didn't dissuade him, as to present himself at that age was to be admired. We never though that at his age, being so small and having never been on a farm that he would work.

We decided that he could come, as he would never be strong enough at his size. He stayed all day, but we thought that would satisfy him (not on your life when your name is Jim!). He was back next morning and never missed a night after school and every school holiday.

First, he would feed the hens and some calves. It was amazing how he grew! His heart and soul were in farming. He had ideas of going to agricultural college on leaving school.

Alas, things didn't quite work out. He lost his mother, which was a big blow. He then had a bad accident on his cycle. The injuries were such to his shoulder that the surgeon advised against physical work. This was a downer for him; however, on leaving school, he found a job in the office of the then Dewhursts Cotton Mill in Skipton.

By this time, Marjorie and I had taken on the farm. As to whether it was Marjorie's cooking, or the farming bug was still there, he still spent weekends and nights with us. All the time he was at Dewhursts. Then, came a life changer. He suddenly announced that Dewhursts had asked him to go for a year to Australia, to work the mill in Sydney. What should he do? My reply was, "Don't miss an opportunity like that, because you could come back after your year if you wish".

It is over 40 years since he went to Sydney, during which time he went from strength to strength. He has moved on, taking on various jobs, then his own business. He married a New Zealand girl. We keep in touch regularly. He and his wife Kath have visited me, and I have holidayed with them.

It is one of those friendships which has lasted 60 years. Jim always claims Marjorie was a great influence during his formative years.

There was a time when Jim was devastated – not being able to continue faming full time. I missed him greatly when he went to Sydney. But things turned out well for him and we have a lot of pleasure keeping in touch, if it's only the price of lambs in Oz.

To complete the story, Jim rang to say he has retired on his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday, 60 years to the day he knocked on Scaleber door.

#### Part 3 of 4: Clutter and happiness

Advertisers want us to aspire to own the things they are marketing: a house full of beautiful furniture, fast cars, the latest technology. The more we own, they tell us, the happier we will be. Up to a point, this is true. Certainly, people with nothing at all are far from happy! Appeals are made to provide water, food, clothes, and medical supplies, for those who have lost everything in a disaster. Babies cry because their needs are not met. Adults cry too.

Owning things that provide warmth and comfort makes us happy. It is easy to assume that if things make us happy, then even more things will make us happier still, and the people who own the most things will be happiest of all. This seems to be the basis of capitalist culture. Happiness, however, does not follow a mathematical equation. Owning more and more eventually creates problems rather than solving them. Wanting is not the same as needing. Precious time and energy goes into maintaining a wealth of possessions, it can become oppressive.

Yet if "God ... richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment" (I Timothy 6:17) surely an abundance of possessions is a sign of God's blessing? Would that mean the ones with the most clutter are the most blessed by God?

But having something to enjoy is not necessarily the same as owning it, or keeping it long term. I Timothy chapter 6 tells us why God blesses people with material goods:

As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to . . . set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches . . . They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous and ready to share (From 1 Tim 6:17,18 NRSV).

So, don't be afraid to give away the things that you really don't need! God's blessings enable us to be hospitable and generous. Once our physical and emotional needs are met, the rest of our possessions are clutter. Creative imagination can come into clearing away too. There are many outlets for selling things, it can be fun taking part in a car boot sale for example. There are even more opportunities to give things away, such as charity shops, and Freegle (aka Freecycle) online. Look around your locality. How could you bless other people from the rich abundance that you have enjoyed?

Generosity towards other people is a great way to express thankfulness to our generous God.
