

WARDEN'S WORDS

I READ A STORY RECENTLY ABOUT A MONASTERY that had fallen on hard times. It had once been part of a great order, now there were only five monks left, all of them over seventy. Clearly it was dying.

One day, the Abbot went to see if his friend the local Rabbi could offer any advice that might save the monastery.

The Rabbi welcomed the Abbot and commiserated. "I know how it is," he said, "the spirit has gone out of people. Almost no-one comes to the synagogue anymore." So they wept together, read parts of the Hebrew Bible and spoke quietly of deep things.

When the abbot had to leave, they embraced. "It has been wonderful being with you," said the Abbot, "but I have failed in my purpose for coming. Have you no piece of advice that might save the monastery?" "Sorry," the Rabbi responded, "I have no advice to give. All I can tell you is that the Messiah is one of you."

When the other monks heard about the Rabbi's words, they wondered what they might mean. "The Messiah is one of us? God's special person here, at our monastery? Do you suppose he meant the Abbot? Of course - it must be the Abbot, our leader for so long. Yes, but maybe it is Brother Thomas. He is undoubtedly a holy man. It certainly would not be Brother Elrod. He is too crotchety; but on the other hand, he is very wise. Brother Phillip? Too passive. But then, magically, he always seems to be there just when you need him. Of course, he didn't mean me - yet supposing he did? Oh Lord, not me! I couldn't mean that much to you, could I?"

As they contemplated in this manner, the old monks began to treat each other with extraordinary respect, just on the off chance that one of them might be the Messiah. And on the really off chance that each monk himself might be the Messiah, they began each to respect himself again.

The beautiful forest attracted people to picnic or wander along the old paths, most of which led to the dilapidated chapel. They sensed the aura that surrounded the five old monks, permeating that atmosphere. They came more frequently and brought their friends; and friends brought friends. Some of the younger men who came to visit began to engage in conversation with the monks. After a while, one asked if he might join them. Then another, and another. Within a few years, the monastery became once again a thriving order, and - thanks to the Rabbi's gift – something that gave light and love to the community around.

The start of the school holidays is also the start of the NYCC **Summer Reading Challenge**.

The summer reading challenge is aimed at children aged 4 to 12, the theme this year is " **The Space Race** "celebrating the decades of space travel. The challenge is to read six library books over the summer and it's free to take part.

The challenge starts on 13th July and runs through to September. When the children sign up they receive a free poster and each time they read two books, they receive a set of stickers, to encourage them to keep reading with the aim of filling in the gaps on the poster.

When they have read six books they receive a 'Space Race' medal and a certificate. The only rule is that the books they read are borrowed from the library, but they can choose whatever they like, including audiobooks.

For the past few years the Library have exceeded the targets set by NYCC for the Reading Challenge, so a big thank to you to all the children who have taken part and, hopefully, with all your help we will be able to exceed the targets for 2019.

This year there is no need for younger siblings to miss out on a reading challenge as NYCC are also running a **Mini Reading Challenge**, this reading scheme is aimed at 0-4 year olds and is again based on the **Space Race**.

By January 1936, the vicar's letter in the Gargrave Parochial Magazine suggests an atmosphere in which clouds were gathering on the horizon. Rev Arthur Blunt describes how "War has broken out in Africa, and there have been rumours and fears of it spreading to Europe, and once more the Nations are re-arming. There is a need of wise statesmanship on all sides to carry us safely through these difficulties and dangers". He also refers to "trouble in the coalfields threatening our industrial life".

In the midst of these worries, readers are exhorted to trust in "Him who is the Way, the Truth and the Life". A diocesan week of prayer and self-denial is advertised, along with the annual parochial gathering in the Village Institute, with entertainment from Sidney Fisher of Cowling and song, dance and sketch by the Smith's Crisps Concert Party of Skipton.

There's also a record of the baptism of Thomas Leslie Guy, on 1 December 1935.

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF ROBERT OF NEWMINSTER AND GARGRAVE – THE SAINT OF THE DALES

Part eight: This wicked world

In medieval days it was felt that much of the misfortune and troubles of the period were due to the wickedness of mankind. (There is a parallel in recent times with climate change being blamed, not on nature, but on how mankind is damaging the planet.) A chronicler named Florence of Worcester, who died in 1118, had this to say about the situation in England in 1087: "In the one and twentieth year after William began to govern and direct England, as God granted him, was a very heavy and pestilent season in this land. Such a sickness came on men, that full nigh every other man was in the worst disorder - that is the fever; and that so dreadfully, that many men died in the disorder. Afterwards came, through the badness of the weather as we before mentioned, so great a famine over all England, that many hundreds of men died a miserable death through hunger. Alas! how wretched and how rueful a time was there! Then the poor wretches lay full nigh driven to death, and afterwards came sharp hunger, and dispatched them entirely! Who will not be penetrated with grief at such a season? Or who is so hardhearted as not to weep at such misfortune? Yet such things happen for folks' sins, that they will not love God and righteousness. So it was in those days, that little righteousness was in this land with any men, but with the monks alone - wherever they fared well. The king and the head men loved much, and overmuch, covetousness in gold and in silver; and cared not how sinfully it was got, provided it came to them."

Our Robert must have known of the Cistercians when he was in Paris, but when he chose the monastic way of life there was probably no Cistercian house in England, but we can't be certain since we don't know when he went to the monastery at Whitby. The first Cistercian foundation was at Waverley, Surrey, in 1128 and the first in the north at Rievaulx, near Helmsley, in 1132, which was mostly due to Bernard of Clairvaux, who by this time was the driving force behind the order. The next great foundation was near Ripon, but this came about in a completely different way. One of the men who moved into the woods on the banks of the River Skell was Robert.

One of the reasons people chose this way of life was to try to atone for the perceived sins of their own and others. The era of gloom could be said to have begun in 793 when the comparatively peaceful existence of northern England was shattered.

The Anglo Saxon Chronicle:

"Here were dreadful forewarnings come over the land of Northumbria, and woefully terrified the people: these were amazing sheets of lightning and whirlwinds, and fiery dragons were seen flying in the sky. A great famine soon followed these signs, and shortly after in the same year, on the sixth day before the ides of January, the woeful inroads of heathen men destroyed god's church in Lindisfarne island by fierce robbery and slaughter."

When the Vikings had learned a little civilisation they left behind some carvings in our church, but not before the monks of Holy Island had to keep

moving with the body of St Cuthbert to keep it safe until they eventually settled in Durham two hundred years later, just a century before the birth of Robert. Before becoming bishop of Lindisfarne Cuthbert had been guest-master at the monastery at Ripon and it almost certain that the influence of Ripon and Wilfred, who founded it, would have been felt here.

Before the people of the north-east acquired nicknames such as Mackem or Geordie they were the Haliwerfolk, the followers and protectors of the saint.

INTO THE DISTANT PAST

FOLLOWING ON from the previous article covering the Mesolthic period of the Hunter Gatherers we now move forward into the Neolithic, Bronze Age and Iron Age.

The Neolithic period 3500-2500 B.C was that of the first farmers and evidence of this period is missing in the story of the Gargrave area. This is probably due to the fact that these early farmers couldn't work the heavy glacial soils with primitive ploughing equipment preferring the lighter soils to the East of the County.

The Bronze Age period 2500-500 BC is not directly represented in Gargrave but there have been various sites upon the slopes of Sharphaw now under the forestry. Bronze Age burial mounds have been recorded and of course the famous Flasby Sword now in the Craven Museum is a high-status object that was recovered from Septeria Gill. There are however two burial mounds remaining that are now Scheduled Ancient Monuments and therefore protected from further disturbance. During the pipeline excavation that took place between the years of 2006-2007 a Bronze Age cairn was recorded at Bank Newton.

The Iron Age period 500 BC-71 AD was evident within Gargrave at two sites. Hut circles at the Kirk Sink Roman Villa site and a cemetery where the houses at Mickle Hill stand. The Mickle Hill site was excavated by the West Yorkshire Archaeological Service and an excavation report resides in the Reference section in Gargrave library. Some information has been published about the cemetery in the Dales Heritage magazine (Issue 6).

Update for 2019: A Neolithic Henge monument has now been recorded near to Priestholme Bridge following the receipt of some Geophysics data which languished on a PC in Leeds. It had never been put into the public record. I ensured that it went into the NYCC Heritage Record. The site is likely to be a protected monument following this data due to its importance.

In the next edition we move onto the Roman Period where there is plenty of evidence of settlement.

I do feel for the next generation of farmers. With all the rules and regulations, with the uncertainty of Brexit looming, a farm almost needs a full time secretary!!!

Am I allowed to be a grumpy grandfather? I recently attended a granddaughter's 21st birthday. It was midweek of course and the guests left shortly after the meal as they were **at work** the next day and were tired. After a busy month lambing their company would be enjoyed. As John would say, "Come when you can stop a while".

As my father and father in law both survived the first war and lived through the second, it was great to see the commemoration of the 75th anniversary of the D Day landings. My own memories of this time when in woods of all the Dales thousands of soldiers were camped in them with vehicles and ammunition, waiting out of sight of the bombers, waiting for D Day.

I was attending what was then the church school when the troops were marching past to the station to the trains. The movement lasted for many days if not weeks.

WHO IS THIS CHRIST?

"I was in an underground train, a crowded train on which all sorts of people jostled together, workers of every description going home at the end of the day. Quite suddenly I saw with my mind, but as vividly as a wonderful picture, Christ in them all. But I saw more than that; not only was Christ in everyone of them, living in them, dying in them, rejoicing in them, sorrowing in them - but because He was in them, and because they were here, the whole world was here too, here in this underground train; not only the world as it is at that moment, not only all the people in all the countries of the world, but all those people who had lived in the past, and all those yet to come.

I came out into the street and it was the same here, on every side, in every passerby, everywhere - Christ Now in a flash of a second, I knew this dream is fact; not a dream, not the fantasy or legend of a devout people, but Christ in man.

After a few days the "vision" faded. People looked the same, there was no longer the same shock of insight for me each time I came face to face with another human being. Christ was hidden again. " Caryll Houselander (1)

If we are Christians, we hear a lot about Jesus, occasionally something about the Holy Spirit but probably nothing much about (the) Christ per se. To most of us Christ is just one of many titles given to Jesus, while non-Christians could be forgiven for thinking it's just his second name! So who is this Christ Houselander saw permeating and radiating from everyone? How is the function of Christ different to Jesus? These are the themes of Richard Rohr's recent book "The Universal Christ" (2). Below is a brief introduction to his insight and understanding.

- The Christ is not limited to the single body of Jesus. Christ is God, and Jesus is the Christ's historical manifestation in time and space. Christ is the manifestation of the Divine in all creation. St Paul's words mirror Houselander's experience: "There is only Christ. He is everything and he is in everything".
- All things visible are the revelation of God's endlessly diffusive spiritual energy. God poured into finite, visible forms, creating and evolving into everything from billions of galaxies and stars to planets, rocks, water, plants, organisms, animals and human beings. This was the first 'Incarnation' the general term for any enfleshment of spirit long before the personal, second Incarnation that Christians believed happened with Jesus. Ordinary matter is the hiding place for the Spirit and thus the very Body of God! The Spirit is always the Christ's Spirit. The third Incarnation of Christ is in the evolving human community Christians call the Body of Christ.
- While Christ pre-existed the universe, Jesus of Nazareth did not. While Jesus "dwelt among us" and lived in Palestine for some 30 years there was not an absence of the Christ within the Triune God. St Paul writes, "Christ

- existed before all things and in union with him all things have their proper place."
- In Jesus the Christ nature within him was made manifest to full capacity. The powers that he is reported to have exercised physical healing, spiritual healing, power over nature he was able to do so not because he was God, but because he was a fully evolved human being. St Paul talks about him as "reaching to the very height of the Christ's full stature". Jesus came to show us how to be human much more than how to be spiritual. The Christian path should be more about letting go and unlearning than ascending spiritually!

When we become aware of the universal dimension of Christ the writings of St Paul begin to make a lot more sense. Similarly, as Rohr warns us, if we have a God, in Jesus, who is merely personal then he can too easily become too sentimental or just tribal. But when we learn to put Jesus and Christ together it gives us a God who we can connect with at both the personal and universal level. Rohr reminds us that the essential function of mature religion is to radically connect us to everything. The word "religion" comes from re-ligio = to re-ligament or reconnect!






