

#### God Save the Queen!

Right now, the country is gearing up for some wonderful celebrations for the Platinum Jubilee for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth the Second. The four-day weekend is set to be a hugely important time in the calendar for millions of people around the Commonwealth as our Queen will be the first British Monarch ever to celebrate 70 years on the throne. This will most likely be a once in a lifetime event for us all.

What many people don't realise is that the Queen is not just the Head of State, but that she is also the Head of the Church of England and that her faith, although largely quiet and low-key, is extremely important to her and has no doubt been a great factor in shaping her life and service. Each week churches around the world pray a special prayer called 'The Collect for the Sovereign'. In that prayer we ask God to

'...rule the heart of thy chosen servant Elizabeth, our Queen and Governor, that she (knowing whose minister she is) may above all things seek thy honour and glory: and that we and all her subjects (duly considering whose authority she hath) may faithfully serve, honour and humbly obey her...'

Now, in today's world of self- determination and freedom, the word 'obey' doesn't sit well with us, particularly when history shows that previous Kings and Queens have ruled with a rod of iron, abusing their power, and creating tremendous fear and suffering amongst their subjects.

However, our Queen's rule has long been associated with service, rather than power, and this service culminated in the publication of a beautiful book on her 90th birthday entitled **'The Servant Queen and the King She Serves'**. The book is still available and is a wonderful reminder of the faith and values which drive Her Majesty throughout her long reign. Rather than authority and power, it is her humility and desire to serve God which really motivate her, marked by her desire to help others.

It may seem odd for someone so famous, rich, and powerful to talk about 'serving' - especially in today's self-obsessed world of social media and greed, but the Bible tells us of a different way of holding power. Jesus is often described as the 'Servant King' and told many parables about how we should treat others, even strangers and foreigners, regarding others as not just equal with but better than ourselves. Ultimately, the Son of God Himself, with all the power of God at His right hand decided not to argue or fight against the accusations wrongly aimed at Him, but chose the way of self-sacrifice, giving up everything to die for others - even those who hated Him.

This is the Christian way, so beautifully modelled by Her Majesty - the way of quiet service, not seeking to self-promote, or to flaunt her wealth and power, but working for the benefit of others, giving up her whole life to 'duty'.

Many a ruler might have retired well before now and opted for a life of leisurely retirement on some tropical island, sipping cocktails in the sun, whilst one's private chef cooks dinner for the Corgis!

Imagine a world where everyone sought to serve one another, rather than pursuing power, advantage, and self-satisfaction. Perhaps it seems like a Christian pipedream and yet, that world is quite within our grasp, so long as we can let go of our ego. It takes faith to let go and to trust that nothing bad will happen if we do give more of ourselves away - our time, our gifts, our talent, and our money. The more we do it the easier it becomes. And in letting go of self we find great freedom and joy; fear subsides and joy increases.

In her Christmas speech 2002, the Queen said:

"I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning, I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God. ...I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel. Fortified by this and the support you have given ...I look forward to continuing to serve you to the very best of my ability each and every day."

May we all follow Her Majesty's incredible example and like her, 'look forward to serving one another to the best of our abilities every day'.

#### Village Hall Jubilee weekend plans

We have planned for our two events for a good six months at least and I am sure they will not disappoint. We plan to bring out the bunting a couple of weeks before the official Jubilee weekend and everything will look very patriotic for our first event on Friday 3rd June. We shall be hosting a right Royal Coffee morning from 10am with lots of homemade cakes on the menu. There will be a stall selling Royal memorabilia and books from the past seventy years and all proceeds from this will go to Manorlands Hospice. The event acts as a valuable fundraiser for the Village Hall. Light refreshments will be available until 3pm. The event opens at 10am and closes at 4pm.

The Village Hall Management Committee and their friends will be back in Royal action again on Sunday 5th June for an afternoon of fantastic vocal enjoyment. The talented local musician, Andy Wiseman will be singing a wide range of songs from the past seventy years. Andy is a great entertainer and has performed at the Hall on previous occasions, generally under the guise of Neil Diamond. The performance commences at 2pm. Homemade afternoon tea will be served in the interval. We decided to put Andy on the spot and create a bit of fun and have asked him to list four of his all-time favourite songs and the audience will have a secret vote during the afternoon with the result given to Andy at the end and he will sing this song as his finale. I wonder if he can guess which title will come out on top. Tickets cost £10.00 per person and must be reserved before the event. #### Gargrave 2022 Group News

Another Wednesday evening filled with new faces, both new to the group and new to the village. Welcome! Our speaker for the evening was a very familiar face to most of us: Linda Hartell, the owner of Gargrave landmark, The Dalesman Café.

Linda was initially a teacher but when, as she recalled, she found herself watching the clock more than her pupils, she decided it was time for a change. On a visit to Gargrave, a desire for a cup of tea took her to the Dalesman café which was for sale... Initially her plan was for a short term stay in the village - Linda in her own words: 'Never intended to spend the next 22 years glued to the grill!'

Accompanied by wit, warmth and humour, Linda mesmerised us with her tales and her talent as she decorated a fruit cake in honour of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Skilled hands used a dazzling array of tools in order to produce a covered cake with a red, white and blue rope edging and a golden-coloured teddy bear sitting on a rug as a centrepiece. We watched in awed silence, as Linda prodded, pummelled and rolled unprepossessing lumps of first marzipan and then sugar paste into smooth platters elegantly coating the awaiting cake.

Cake decorating's fascinating combination of discipline, practicality and creativity was epitomised in the making of the teddy bear. Linda explained that there are three basic shapes when modelling (round, cone and sausage) and demonstrated two of them as a round(ish) shape became the body and cones became legs, arms and a nose. Red cheeks were added using specialist powder paint and a paint brush. Dimples in the ears and the bear's eye sockets were made using a ball tool. Finally, with incredible delicacy, Linda gave the Jubilee Bear its facial features using dots of royal icing. No Bake- Off style piping bag disasters here!

Linda very generously donated the cake to the group and it was decided that the cake would be

raffled with funds raised going to a local charity. Marcia Firth was the extremely happy winner!

As Abbie said in her vote of thanks, we were entranced for over an hour and as we all dispersed for refreshments, Linda was still busy giving a master-class or two to several of our own skilled bakers and confectioners. Linda couldn't say accurately how many hundreds of cakes she has decorated but her energy and enthusiasm still shines out- proving in Linda's case at least, that you can have your cake and eat it too!



## Local school children work on a new public art project for Gargrave

Artist Alex Blakey has been working alongside the Aire Rivers Trust to deliver workshops to local schools as part of the River Reflections public art project for Gargrave. 

#### FARMING ON SCALEBER HILL

LAMBING TIME IS NOW OVER except for 3 late lambers which are showing no sign of lambing anytime soon. The lambs have all now been vaccinated for orf - a skin condition which causes blistering around the mouth and nose which, if untreated, can also affect the ewes udder consequently leading to mastitis. The lambs have also been given our own farm identity mark which is a green and red spray mark on the wool. This is particularly useful as some sheep and lambs have to be taken to away land to allow the meadows at home to grow a crop of silage.

Despite the extortionate price, Brian has succumbed and bought just enough fertilizer to add to the small amount we had left over from last year. This has now been applied (sparingly!) to the meadows where there has been no manure spread so far this year. Going forward slurry and bedding muck will be spread once the silage crop has been taken.

The spring calving season is now underway for the suckler cows. The first to calve have been turned out to pasture with their new-born calves and are enjoying the spring sunshine and lush grass.

We have also started to turn-out all the other cattle from their winter quarters. It is a pleasure to watch them kick their heels and excitedly charge off into the distance. It is true to say that in Autumn they let you know they are ready to come in for the winter by standing bawling at the gate but come Spring they get "giddy" (excited) at the prospect of fresh air, sunshine and fresh grass.

The first swallows arrived back at Scaleber on the 30<sup>th</sup> April and are now busy nest building in the barns. It always amazes me how such a small, delicate bird can travel nearly 6,000 miles to Africa and back each year and avoid all the hazards on the way.

Whilst carrying out Spring field work over the last couple of weeks it has been heartening to see so many hares and leverets and also a number of curlew nests with eggs. We hope that this is in some part due to our ongoing pest control efforts against carrion crows and magpies which both predate heavily on all ground nesting birds and leverets.

#### NOTHING STANDS ALONE

Richard Rohr meditations

The above title is the theme of a current series of meditations by the popular spiritual teacher Richard Rohr.

As our consciousness evolves and matures, both at a personal and cultural level, we are able to gain fresh new insights into the nature of God. This month Rohr shows us how the divine feminine has been at work at all times and in all places, even when she has not been affirmed or even recognized.

#### The Divine Feminine

Today on many levels, we are witnessing an immense longing for the mature feminine at every level of our society—from our politics to our economics, in our psyche, our cultures, our patterns of leadership, and our theologies, all of which have become far too competitive, mechanistic, dualistic and aggressive. We are terribly imbalanced.

Like the Christ Mystery itself, the deep feminine often works underground and in mysterious ways, and—from that position—creates a much more intoxicating message. While church and culture have often denied women roles, offices, and formal authority, the Divine Feminine has continued to exercise incredible power at the cosmic and personal levels. Feminine power is deeply relational and thus transformative, bringing new life from both the womb and the symbolic tombs where we have locked away our hurt and pain.

Hear this magnificently courageous poem from the Book of Proverbs 8:30–31:

"I was by God's side, a master craftswoman, delighting God day after day, ever at play in God's presence, at play everywhere in God's world, delighting to be with the children of humans."

The mystic and Doctor of the Church Hildegard of Bingen (1098–1179) proclaimed the feminine aspects of God, challenging both church and culture. Although Hildegard was recognized as a saint among her own people . . . over the ages, her teachings faded into obscurity. It has only been since the twentieth century, in light of a renewed interest in feminine spirituality, that Hildegard's transmission has been revivified. Her recognition of nature as sacred and her outstanding musical gifts directly address our contemporary hunger for a spirituality that is both socially relevant and passionately alive.

Hildegard was smitten with the creator and enamoured by every element of creation. Her mysticism is intimate and even erotic. She coined the term 'viriditas' to evoke the lush, extravagant, moist, and verdant quality of the Divine, manifesting as the "greening power" that permeates all that is. This lifegiving energy is imbued with a distinctly feminine quality. For Hildegard, the Son may be the incarnation of the Holy One [in human form], but the Mother forms the very stuff from which the Word of God issues forth into the world:

The earth is at the same time mother, she is the mother of all that is natural, mother of all that is human.

She is the mother of all, for contained in her are the seeds of all.

Turning to the New Testament listen to Biblical scholar Virginia Mollenkott explore the frequent imagery of God as Mother:

More pervasive than any other biblical image of God as female is the image of a maternal deity. Not only is the Creator depicted as carrying in the womb or birthing the creation, but also Christ and the Holy Spirit are depicted in similar roles....

A serene, transcendent image of God the Mother occurs in Acts 17:26 and 28, during Paul's speech to the Athenian Council of the Areopagus. Paul declares that God is not dependent on anything, since God is the one who has given life and breath to everyone. Furthermore, this God is not far from any of us, for it is in God that we live, and move, and exist. Although the apostle does not specifically name the womb, at no other time in human experience do we exist within another person. Thus, Paul pictures the entire human race—people of all colours, all religions, all political and economic systems—as living, moving, and existing within the cosmic womb of the One God


#### **GETTING TO KNOW ME!**

#### RECIPE OF THE MONTH: QUEEN OF PUDDINGS

Queen of puddings recipe taken as it is written from a collection of recipes put together for St Peter's Church many years ago complied by Mrs Arthur Caton, not dated.

4 oz breadcrumbs

1 pint milk

2 oz butter

Grated rind 1 lemon

3 yolks of eggs (save egg whites)

2oz butter

1 tablespoon raspberry jam

Meringue: 3 egg whites 4 oz sugar

#### Method

Boil milk and pour over breadcrumbs, add sugar, lemon rind and butter. Cool slightly. Add egg yolks, pour into greased pie dish. Cook in oven until set, spread with jam. Whisk egg whites until stiff, fold in sugar and pile on top of the pudding. Brown top slightly, then cook in a slow oven for 1 hour! Interesting how oven temperatures are referred to as "slow".




